Describe any changes and reasons for changes in the original implementation plan.

The counties had difficulty securing the matching funds needed to implement the program and the county governments were slower than anticipated in processing the needed paperwork.

- 3) Has the grant made a difference in the quality of services that you provide and/or in your organizational effectiveness? If so, in what ways? If not, what obstacles limited your work.
 - Without the support of this grant, WV counties would lack the funds to independently finance the start-up costs and training of first responders to implement Project Lifesaver.
 - WV County budgets have no line item for search and rescue so to provide a
 conventional search and rescue the money has to come out of other line items such as
 training and equipment. Once Project Lifesaver is introduced into the county, the
 cost of a search is nominal so a search does not affect the county operating budget.
 - Every law enforcement officer trained with project lifesaver receives 18 in-service hours for basic search and rescue and 8 in-service hours for the basic in house instructor training at no cost to the county.
 - County officials and first responders become aware of the number of individuals in their county that have cognitive limitations and the complications that go along with searching for those individuals.
- 4) What impact did the grant have on the population you serve?
 - Caregivers have stated knowing there are individuals specifically trained to search for their loved one and the average search is under 30 minutes has provided them with added peace of mind.
 - First Responders say if they only have to search for one person and they are found successfully, it is worth the money spent on the program.

- First Responders are trained in working with people with cognitive limitations. This is a benefit for the first responder who has only seen the person in a mental hygiene setting. It is also a benefit for the individual with the cognitive impairment to see the first responder as a person behind the uniform.
- 5) During the course of the project, did anything happen that was different from what you expected?

Once a county voiced an interest in Project Lifesaver, the process of implementing the program in the county took much longer than anticipated. Reasons for this include:

- Slow response of county officials in approving and appointing a lead agency
- Slowness of completing and returning needed Project Lifesaver paperwork
- Scheduling training dates due to the specific nature of first responders schedules
- Territorial issues and lack of cooperation between first responders
- 6) How will the lessons you learned change your future thinking, performance, or services?
 - Understand the complexities of county government and plan accordingly
 - Reinforcing the belief that programs working together to benefit our citizens is much better than territorial programs.
- 7) Provide a story related to this project that illustrates the effectiveness of the grant.

The best way to illustrate the effectiveness of Project Lifesaver using these grant monies are as follows.

Nicholas County requested Project Lifesaver and on November 8-10, 2010 nine deputies from the Nicholas County Sheriff's Department were trained as Project Lifesaver Electronic Search Specialists. At the time of training, all of the equipment was taken to the county and tested before the training ended. One of the receivers was found to be defective and was not left in Nicholas County – but taken so it could be returned for another receiver. This left Nicholas county with just one receiver. After the training, the sheriff's department was to begin setting up the program while waiting on the replacement of the defective receiver. The sheriff's department was contacted regarding a gentlemen with Alzheimer's who had wondered off. The funny thing was he was not on the Nicholas county program because they had not gone "live" per say. The sheriff's department discovered the family had obtained the bracelet from Virginia for this individual. They were able to use the frequency number the family provided and within 16 minutes he was found safe and sound. What is so impressive about this incident is with limited equipment and only training experience the Nicholas County Sheriff's department was able to bring this family's loved one home safely within a matter of minutes.

9) Sustainability Plan Status Report: Describe the steps taken to address the long-term funding and/or sustainability of the project.

At the completion of the five year plan (December 1, 2007 – November 30, 2012), every county in West Virginia will have the basic equipment, training and necessary funding resources to maintain Project Lifesaver. The responsibilities of the Project Administrator should have decreased to the point that either a Liaison/Instructor or a trained volunteer can administer the program. Therefore, no additional funding for the West Virginia Project Lifesaver State Coordinator would likely be necessary. To date, funding for the State Coordinator will end July 31, 2011. At that time there will be 20 counties which will need training and technical support from the State Coordinator to provide Project Lifesaver services to the citizens of those counties. From July 31, 2011 to end the project on November 30, 2012, \$21,000 will need to be secured to provide the training and technical assistance which the State Coordinator provides. Presently funding acquisition is being researched to provide the \$21,000 to see Project Lifesaver in all 55 counties of West Virginia.
