Wood County Schools CIA Program

Objective: To expose at-risk students to members of the community such as local government agency representatives and volunteers who can provide them with information about rights and responsibilities as citizens as well as career guidance for the future. Students will work as a group to identify an issue/problem in the community that can be addressed through a show of civic responsibility and then devise and carry out a plan to address that issue/problem.

History: Wood County Schools Civics Literacy Council piloted this program at Hamilton Middle School in the 2011-2012 school year. Twenty-five students were selected to participate and appropriate permission slips and media waivers were signed by parents of each. Students participated in two all-day field trips.

The first outing consisted of traveling to downtown Parkersburg and visiting the Wood County Justice Center as well as the Court House. Students participated in a mock trial in which their teacher Mrs. Knicely was arrested. Students held a copy of the Bill of Rights and as the trial ensued, they discussed which right correlated with the events at hand. The students were members of the jury that convicted Mrs. Knicely and on appeal, the trial moved to Circuit Court. Students met with Circuit Court Judge Waters. He discussed why he became a judge and explained some of his responsibilities. Students ate lunch in the Court Room with the Judge and Wood County Commissioner David Couch. The group then traveled to the County Commission, County Clerk, and Assessor's offices and to experienced first-hand the business that takes place in each. Students then witnessed early voting taking place and discussed the responsibilities of citizens to be educated and responsible voters.

The second outing was sponsored by the Wood County Solid Waste Authority and took place at Fort Boreman Park. A representative of the WCSWA presented information on recycling in our area. Students also met with an officer from the WV Division of Natural Resources as well as the Department of Environmental Protection. These representatives spoke with them about the responsibility of citizens to monitor their environment, providing them with ideas of future career opportunities if they continue their education. The event was topped off with a visit from local volunteers who reenact Civil War battles. These gentlemen spoke with the students about their volunteerism and keeping history alive. To wrap off the day they fired off their cannon for the students.

Enrollment: 25 at risk students per school. Grades 6-8. In the first year of the program, schools should have more 6th graders than 7th and 8th so that their progress can be tracked and they can be replaced with incoming 6th graders.

Content Standards addressed:

- **SS.6.C.5** Examine and analyze various acts of patriotism and civil discourse in response to events throughout U.S. history
- **SS.6.C.6** Research and organize information about an issue of global concern from multiple points of view
- **SS.6.C.7** identify global relief and development organizations and examine how they provide global aid and support.
- SS.7.G.4 examine and summarize the effects of human/environmental reaction.

- **SS.8.C.2** evaluate how citizens can influence and participate in government at the local, state and national levels assume the role of an active citizen participating in the democratic process (voting, community service, letter writing and school elections.)
- **SS.8.C.3** identify, analyze and evaluate the responsibilities, privileges and rights as citizens of the state of WV found in state and national constitutions.
- **SS.8C.4** differentiate between the division of powers and responsibilities for each of the executive, legislative and judicial branches of the U.S and WV governments and describe the system of checks and balances.
- **SS.8.C.5** cite the elected officials at the national, state and local levels, the constitutional requirements for election and responsibilities of each office.
- **SS.8.C.9** analyze the functions and jurisdictions of the federal, state, local and special courts.

Publicity Plan: To provide publicity for participating county, schools and funding entities a PR campaign will be put into place. P.R. will include the following:

- ♦ Informing local media (television, radio and press) of the project
- Inviting local media to observe the project in process as it unfolds at the schools
- Inviting local media to interview funders as they interact with students as part of the project (more details forthcoming depending on who the funders are and on the exact nature of the project)
- Inviting local media to attend event
- Inviting local media to interview funders/students/parents (with parental consent) about the project at the event and/or upon project completion

Data needed for tracking success of program: attendance, discipline, and grades. Teacher comments will be collected as well.

Future Goal: Wood County Schools plans to activate this program in all six middle schools in the county. Those would include Van Devender, Williamstown, Hamilton, Jackson, Blennerhassett, and Edison Middle Schools. This would increase enrollment in the program to 150 students. The plan would include classroom lessons and special guests. The Solid Waste Authority would like to have public service announcements placed on their website. This would be a great opportunity for the students to practice their technological and collaboration skills in an experiential learning environment. Meeting once a week would be ideal while taking field trips every three months. The field trips are still in the planning stages but the idea is to get all schools to visit three designated sites in a rotating manner.

Purpose

The Program is co-sponsored by the DEP and Quad Graphics of Martinsburg. It is designed to unite existing youth groups such as 4-H clubs, scouts, kindergarten, elementary, junior high/middle and high schools, FFA chapters, church youth fellowships, and others toward the common goal of Making West Virginia Shine! The program provides incentive to the groups to actively participate in environmental projects. It creates an interest and enthusiasm for preserving our natural resources, with more than \$11,000 in cash and other awards including a college scholarship.

How To Become Involved

Youth groups can become involved in the West Virginia Youth Environmental Program by simply enrolling at any time. There is no obligation and no cost. Each group that enrolls receives informative materials, including an official certificate of enrollment, lists of available awards, the award sponsors, project ideas, and criteria for reporting.

Youth groups enrolled in the program must submit a report of their projects to become eligible for more than \$11,000 in awards. Projects are to be completed from April 16 of the current year through April 15 of the next year. These reports are judged and the winning youth groups are presented their awards at the Annual Youth Environmental Day.
