





ORDINANCE FOR WOOD COUNTY

PROHIBITION OF DRILLING INTO AND EXTRACTION OF GROUNDWATER

WHEREAS, the County Commission of Wood County, West Virginia is addressing the cleanup of groundwater in the Mineral Wells area of Wood County; and

WHEREAS, West Virginia Division of Highways (WVDOH) is the current owner of a parcel of land located on State Route 14 at the Mineral Wells exit of I-77, formerly used as a gas station/convenience store, that has been the subject of environmental assessment and risk based remediation as part of the Uniform Environmental Covenant Act program with the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection (WVDEP); and

WHEREAS, the environmental assessment has indicated that "chemicals of concern" from previous businesses located on the Site are now contained in the groundwater beneath the Site and have migrated into surrounding groundwater; and

WHEREAS, WVDOH, in cooperation with WVDEP, has notified the County of the migration, and has requested that the County take protective action to prevent the uncontrolled exposure to the chemicals of concern in the groundwater; and

WHEREAS, the Wood County Commission has the duty and authority under W. Va. State Code § 7-1-3kk to provide for the elimination of hazards to public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, the Wood County Health Department is the governmental agency with authority to issue permits with respect to groundwater drilling within Wood County;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF WOOD COUNTY, WEST VIRGINIA:

THAT there is hereby established within Wood County, West Virginia, a Restricted Use Area in which the drilling into or extraction of groundwater is prohibited. The Restricted Use Area is defined as 200 feet to the west, 500 feet to the south, and 150 feet to the east of the center of the contaminant plume located on the Site, including the right of way to the north of and adjacent to the Site, as depicted on the map attached as Exhibit 1 hereto. This area represent the maximum predicted extent of contamination migration plus a conservative safety factor.

Groundwater is defined as water occurring in the zone of saturation beneath the seasonal high water table, or any perched water zone.

This prohibition applies to any excavation or penetration in the ground, whether drilled, bored, cored, driven or jetted that enters or passes through ground water for the purposes that include, but are not limited to, a water supply, exploration for water, dewatering or heat pump wells. This prohibition shall not include groundwater monitoring activities.






































Nothing contained in this ordinance shall prevent any construction activity within the Restricted Use Area which is not for the purpose of using groundwater and does not contemplate the disruption of groundwater during construction. Additionally, nothing in this ordinance shall prohibit any construction activity within the Restricted Use Area which is not for the purpose of using groundwater but that may result in incidental disturbance of groundwater, provided all state laws and regulations applicable to construction under such conditions, including, but not limited to, all laws and regulation enforced and promulgated by WVDEP, are verifiably met. If incidental disturbance of groundwater occurs, the contractor shall provide notice of the disturbance to the Office of Environmental Remediation of WFDEP (304.926.0455), and reference UECA Project #09131.

Nothing contained in this ordinance shall prevent the use of groundwater in the Restricted Use Area if the groundwater had been treated to meet state standards appropriate for its intended use prior to any use.
