involving an employee paid out of the county general fund did require commission approval. Harrison County Comm'n v. Harrison County Assessor, — W. Va. —, 658 S.E.2d 555, 2008 W. Va. LEXIS 2 (2008).

Employment decisions made for political reasons prohibited. — The first amendment to the United States Constitution and W. Va. Const., art. III, § 7 do not confer any right upon a governmental employee to continued employment. Under certain circumstances, those provisions do, however, extend a protection to governmental employees to be free from employment decisions made solely for political reasons. Therefore, this section may not be interpreted as permitting a governmental employer to make employment decisions based solely upon political reasons unless the employees hold certain types of positions. Adkins v. Miller, 187 W. Va. 774, 421 S.E.2d 682, 1992 W. Va. LEXIS 159 (1992).

Leaves of absence left to employer discretion. — The granting or withholding of leaves of absence to the employees of the elected county officials mentioned in this section is a function of the employer, not of the county commission. Op. Att'y Gen., June 25, 1976.

Authority to fix compensation of deputy or employee. — County commission has no authority to fix the compensation of a deputy, assistant or employee of a named county official stated in this section, but the named county official may, in fact, compensate any deputy, assistant or employee, in the absence of any civil service requirement to the contrary, in an amount which he, the county official, deems appropriate, to the extent that the overall compensation of such deputies, assistants or employees does not exceed the total budget sum previously approved by the county commission. Op. Att'y Gen., Feb. 17, 1976.

This section prohibits a sheriff from raising deputies' salaries if the increases cause his expenses to exceed the county commission approved budget for his office. State ex rel. Cabell County Deputy Sheriff's Ass'n v. Dunfee, 163 W. Va. 539, 258 S.E.2d 117, 1979 W. Va. LEXIS 423 (1979).

Circuit clerks to fix rate of compensation. — Circuit clerks, not circuit judges, are to fix the compensation of their assistants, deputies, and employees under this section and an order by a circuit judge directing that the circuit clerk treat courtroom clerks in a certain

manner with respect to rights and benefits is improper. State ex rel. Core v. Merrifield, 202 W. Va. 100, 502 S.E.2d 197, 1998 W. Va. LEXIS 14 (W. Va. 1998).

In-year raise from unused funds. — A department head is not prohibited from granting an in-year raise to an employee from unused, allocated funds, as long as the department head does not exceed the maximum amount of funds allotted to his department by the county commission. Op. Att'y Gen., June 23, 1975

Liability for wage and hour violations.

— County commissions and sheriffs are joint employers of deputy sheriffs and may be held liable for violations of the wage and hour law. Amoroso v. Marion County Comm'n, 172 W. Va. 342, 305 S.E.2d 299, 1983 W. Va. LEXIS 561 (1983); McCarty v. Harless, 181 W. Va. 719, 384 S.E.2d 164, 1989 W. Va. LEXIS 180 (1989).

Since the sheriff and county commission have a clear legal duty to pay overtime properly performed and reported, any monies owed for overtime should be paid first from the sheriff's budget until exhausted. Once the sheriff's budget is depleted, the county commission is responsible for amounts legally owed. McCarty v. Harless, 181 W. Va. 719, 384 S.E.2d 164, 1989 W. Va. LEXIS 180 (1989).

Joint employers.—The county commission and the individual elected county officials are joint employers of employees in the various county offices. Fury v. County Court, 608 F. Supp. 198, 1985 U.S. Dist. LEXIS 21891 (S.D.W. Va. 1985).

Mandamus. — Mandamus lies to compel a county commission to comply with this section where the commission has arbitrarily fixed the overall budget of a county officer without having consulted with the county officer as to the amount of funds which is "reasonable and proper" for the performance of the statutory duties of his office. State ex rel. Lambert v. Cortellessi, 182 W. Va. 142, 386 S.E.2d 640, 1989 W. Va. LEXIS 214 (1989).

§ 7-7-7a. Limit of budget expenditures.

(a) No county clerk, circuit clerk, joint clerk of the county commission and circuit court, if any, sheriff, county assessor or prosecuting attorney may, without the approval of the county commission, spend or obligate, before the

no order shall be drawn on the county treasury "unless authorized by a special order or appropriation of the county count..."

W. Va. Code § 7-7-9 provides the procedure for payment of compensation to elected officials, their assistants, deputies and employees. This code section states in part:

"The county court [county commission], after the filing of the budget statement specified in section seven [§7-7-7] of this article, may, by order of general record, authorize and order a draft on the county treasurer, payable out of the general county fund, to be drawn in favor of the county official, assistant, deputy or employees named in this statement, in payment of the compensation to which the person is entitled."

The budget statement referred to in this code section is the detailed statement that must be filed with the clerk of the county commission on or before June 30. This statement sets forth the name, title and amount to be paid to each employee. As noted in your letter, you fulfilled the requirements of this code section on June 29, 2004 and the total amount for personal services did not exceed \$542,350 which was previously approved by the County Commission in their Levy Estimate — Budget. The county commission has the authority to cause a draft to be issued for payroll purposes by order of "general record" for payroll purposes negating the necessity to create a special order each payroll period.

As the above sections state and case law confirms, as long as you remain within your personnel services appropriation, the determination regarding salary is yours and does not need further county commission approval. See, Cooke v. Jairell, et al., No. 12982 (October 1970), attached hereto.

In addition, with regard to the Assessor's Valuation Fund, W. Va. Code § 11-1C-8(d) states that the County Commission may not exercise any control over the fund.

I hope this response adequately addresses your concerns and provides guidance in the execution of the duties and responsibilities of your office. This does not constitute a legal opinion, but rather our interpretation of the facts as

This AGREEMENT is made and entered into this the 1st day of July 2014 by and between the State of West Virginia, the Division of Culture and History and the Records Management and Preservation Board, hereinafter referred to as WVDCH, and the Wood County Commission, hereinafter referred to as GRANTEE.

WHEREAS, the WVDCH is expressly authorized by Article 1, Chapter 29 of the *Code* of West Virginia, One Thousand Nine Hundred Thirty-One, as amended, on behalf of the Records Management and Preservation Board, in the exercise of its lawful duties, to administer state funds appropriated through the West Virginia Legislature from the public records and preservation revenue account to be granted by the Records Management and Preservation Board to county government entities participating in the County Records Management and Preservation Grant Program, Title 100 CSR1; and

WHEREAS, the GRANTEE submitted a request for funds to support a records project under the County Records Management and Preservation Grant Program, which the Records Management and Preservation Board approved on January 10, 2014 to provide \$10,000 to the GRANTEE, as per Number 3 of this Agreement, and/or any provisos thereto stipulated by the Records Management and Preservation Board and agreed to by the GRANTEE.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

- 1. The WVDCH and the GRANTEE agree to cooperate in the implementation of the records management and preservation project referenced above and in compliance with Records Management and Preservation Board rules, regulations and policies.
- 2. The term of this project shall be for fiscal year July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015, or through completion of the project, whichever comes first.
- 3. The WVDCH agrees to grant to the GRANTEE the sum of \$10,000, the county must provide a cash match of at least ten percent (10%) of all grant funds expended. The Records Management and Preservation Board award must be expended as follows:

County Clerk: \$10,000 for personnel costs to scan and index deed books using the county's records management program in the county clerk's office.

- 4. The GRANTEE certifies that it has the required cash-matching capabilities as submitted in its referenced grant application.
- 5. The WVDCH only agrees to transfer funds to reimburse the grantee on a quarterly basis for eligible expenditures in the referenced grant as provided in the Grant Management Packet (Invoice and supporting documentation).
- 6. The GRANTEE agrees to comply with all applicable federal, state and county laws, rules, regulations and policies, including but not restricted to purchasing and competitive bidding rules and procedures for purchases of equipment, services, and hiring or employing staff or contract workers, promulgated thereunder.
- 7. The GRANTEE hereby represents that it possesses the legal authority to contract for this Agreement, as per copy of the resolution, motion or similar action which was clearly adopted by the County Commission; and further, that it has directed and authorized the official representative to act in connection with this Agreement.
- 8. The GRANTEE agrees to submit quarterly Project Status Reports, Project Financial Expenditure Status Reports, supporting documentation and forms. The Final Report is due within 90 days of completion of the grant project.
- 9. The GRANTEE agrees to provide Government Pricing for goods and services and to maintain accurate records in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures, and to comply with requirements of the Single Audit Act of 1984 and OMB Circular A-128, in connection with referenced grant.
- 10. The GRANTEE agrees to obtain prior approval from the director of Archives and History, as staff to the Records Management and Preservation Board, for any amendment to the scope of work, products, budget, or reporting requirements.
- 11. It is the understanding of all parties to this Agreement that the WVDCH, by joining in this Agreement, does not pledge, or promise to pledge, the assets of the State of West Virginia, and does not promise to pay any part of the contract sum provided in this agreement from the monies of the Treasury of the State of West Virginia, except such monies as shall be appropriated by the West Virginia Legislature.
- 12. The GRANTEE shall hold and save the WVDCH and its officers, agents and employees harmless from liability of any nature, including cost and expense, for or on account of any suits or damages of any character whatsoever resulting from injuries or damages sustained by any persons or property resulting in whole or in part from the negligent performance or omission of any employee, agent or representative of the GRANTEE.

13. This Agreement may be terminated with the consent of both parties or by either party because of non-performance by the other. Such termination must be in writing and GRANTEE must submit a final report, on the form provided in the Grant Management Packet, documenting work performed and expenditures incurred during the term of the Agreement. GRANTEE must request grant extensions in writing to the Director on or before April 1st of the grant year. The request must demonstrate a good faith effort to conduct and make progress on the project for which the RMPB funds were made available; include a statement explaining and providing justification for failure to complete the project and provide a written schedule and explanation for completion of the project within the period of time requested, this being no later than December 31 of the calendar year the grant was to have been completed. A county which receives a grant for the forthcoming fiscal year may not request an extension on the current fiscal year's grant.
