The proposed using the salary from an employee who left to increase her employees pay. The Commission agreed to allow a budget revision to accomplish her request. 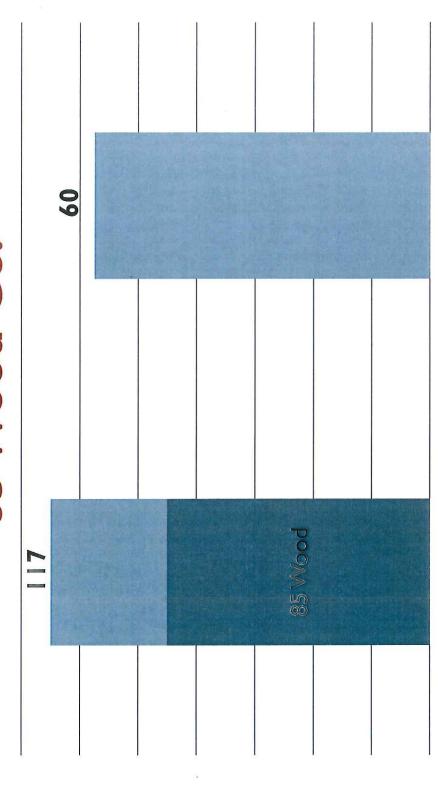

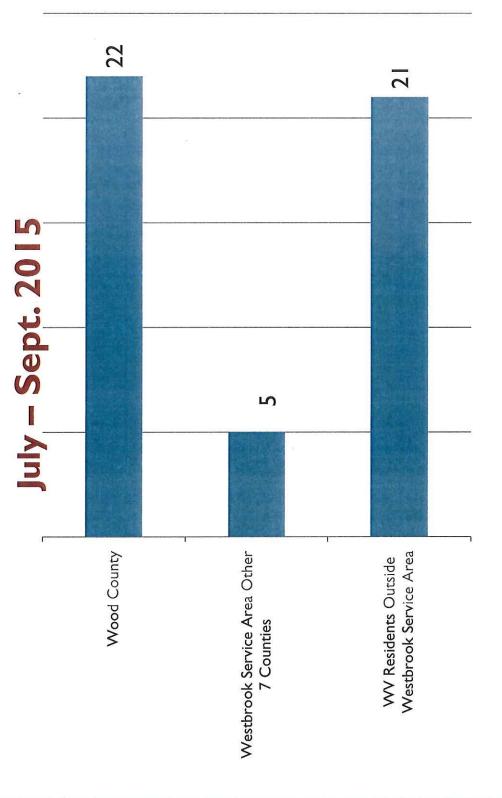
Amity Treatment Center 177 Total Admissions Jan-Sept. 2015 85 Wood Co.
