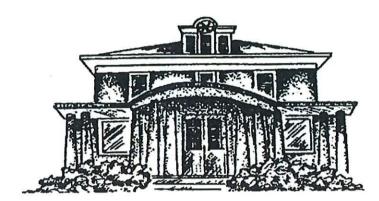

The Hope Recovery Manor is a sober living program that started from an idea coming from the Junior League of Parkersburg's Community Research Committee. They couldn't help but see the huge problem staring them in the face – drug addiction. We are now losing a second generation to drugs! Parents who are incarcerated or unable to function have left children in our communities in peril.

In the Parkersburg area, several facilities and programs have begun to address the problem. Most of them, however, target men. There are not enough facilities for women. Furthermore, as one grantor stated, "We are not going to fund any more rehab programs. What we need is sober living programs to help people change their lives and stay sober and clean."

The Hope Recovery Manor and its two-year Program is an answer to help women begin to learn how to live clean and sober after going through recovery. During their first year, up to 12 women will reside at the Manor, a beautiful historic home at 1016 Market Street. They will be supervised 24/7 by an Executive Director, House Manager and peer support staff. The holistic program will provide healthy living experiences, teaching, counseling, employment assistance, spiritual encouragement, and much more. After living in the Manor for one year, they will begin to live on their own. To help them transition, they will receive \$1,000 back from the program fees they will have paid during the first year. The goal of the program is to establish them into a stable living environment with a sustainable job as they continue to receive counseling and mentoring through the Hope Recovery Manor Program.

We are seeking sponsors ready to invest in this program and the property. Assistance is needed to make the property ready to launch this desperately needed program in our community. The property is in need of upgrades to meet codes that are estimated to cost in excess of \$200,000. The bulk of this money is for a sprinkler system and other fire safety requirements. We know it will take a community to make this happen and are asking you to invest in this program.
