PARKERSBURG, W.Va. (June 19, 2019) –Many West Virginians believe that the time is right for conversations about issues facing our state that bring people together who don't normally talk and work together, conversations that will encourage fresh, innovative thinking to emerge. That's the idea behind 2019 Civic Life Institute being sponsored by the WV Center for Civic Life July 18-19 on the campus of West Virginia University Parkersburg.

The WV Center for Civic Life is a nonpartisan, nonprofit organization that convenes public workshops and provides resources to help people develop productive ways to address common concerns. Over the past twenty years, the WVCCL has partnered with hundreds of organizations and thousands of individuals in community-based initiatives to address issues related to the health, education, and economic well-being of West Virginia residents, such as What's Next, WV, a statewide initiative designed to help communities plan actions based on their own ideas for building stronger local economies.

"We need to find ways to talk to each other, especially when we disagree," said Jean Ambrose, WVCCL representative. "It is our goal to help diverse sectors in communities develop habits of listening to each other and together take ownership of problems, working toward solutions that work for all."

Peabody award winner Trey Kay, producer of the nationally-recognized *Us & Them* podcast, will lead a session at the Institute that explores the cultural issues that often divide us. Following his remarks, participants will experience ways of facilitating community discussions that explore different points of view while working together on difficult issues. *Us & Them* is a joint project of West Virginia Public Broadcasting, PRX and Trey Kay Productions.

Rounds/Questions: The Living Room Conversation Starts Here

Inspired by the podcast Next Door Strangers, this Living Room Conversation begins with a 15-minute podcast: http://www.kuer.org/post/1-tribalism-101-pick-side. We invite you to listen and then begin your Living Room Conversation.

Tribalism: the behavior and attitudes that stem from strong loyalty to one's own tribe or social group. People on the left and right may disagree on many things, but they generally agree that "tribalism" is bad for our politics and our country. Although most people want communities where all people have dignity and respect, respectful interactions are often not what we see modeled in the media and in politics. How do we build strong and unified communities in a divisive time?

Introductions: Getting Started / Why Are We Here?

• What interested you or drew you to this conversation?

Round One: Core Values

Answer one or more of the following:

- What sense of purpose / mission / duty guides you in your life?
- What would your best friend say about who you are?
- What are your hopes and concerns for your community and/or the country?

Round Two: Tribalism 101: Next Door Strangers

Begin with every person answering the following question:

• Name one or more groups you feel at home or strongly identify with (where you find a sense of belonging and/or feel stronger together).

Continue by answering one or more of the following questions:

- What generalizations do you think people make about your group? Which are accurate? Which are inaccurate? Which are most painful?
- What generalizations do you make about other groups? How do you evaluate or check the validity of your generalizations, if at all? How important is it to you that your generalizations are accurate?
- Some groups come together based on sharing a common culture, vision, or enemy. What is the commonality for your group? What need does your group fulfill in your life?

Round Three: Reflection & Next Steps

Answer one or more of the following questions:

- In one sentence, share what was most meaningful / valuable to you in the experience of this Living Room Conversation.
- What learning, new understanding or common ground was found on this topic?
- Has this conversation changed your perception of anyone in this group, including yourself?
- What is one important thing you thought was accomplished here?
- Is there a next step you would like to take based upon the conversation you just had?

Closing - Thank you! Please complete the feedback form to help improve Living Room Conversations.





Overview

In Living Room Conversations, a small group of people (ideally six) come together to get to know one another in a more meaningful way. Guided by a simple and sociable format, participants practice being open and curious about all perspectives, with a focus on learning from one another, rather than trying to debate the topic at hand.

Conversation Agreements

Be curious and open to learning. Conversation is as much about listening as it is about talking. Enjoy hearing all points of view. Maintain an attitude of exploration.

Show respect and suspend judgment. Human beings tend to judge one another; do your best not to. Setting judgments aside opens you up to learning from others and makes them feel respected and appreciated.

Find common ground and note differences. Look for common ground you can agree on and take an interest in the differing beliefs and opinions of others.

Be authentic and welcome that from others. Share what's important to you. Speak authentically from your personal experience. Be considerate of others who are doing the same.

Be purposeful and to the point. Notice if what you are conveying is or is not pertinent to the topic at hand.

Own and guide the conversation. Take responsibility for the quality of your participation and that of the conversation. Be proactive in getting yourself and others back on track if needed.

Though feedback is consistently positive, some people are concerned about managing people that dominate the conversation as well as off-topic, or disruptive situations during the Living Room Conversation. We offer these tips:

- Everyone shares responsibility for guiding the conversation and is invited to help keep the conversation on track.
- The group can decide to keep track of time in some way to help people remember to keep their comments similar in length to others. Soft music when the time is up is a great reminder.
- If an area of interest has arisen that has taken the group off topic, ask the group if they would like to set aside the new topic for a separate Living Room Conversation.
- If someone is dominating, disruptive or has found their soapbox, respectfully interrupt the situation, refer to the Conversation Agreements and invite everyone to get back on track with the current question
