AMERICAN RED CROSS MONTH 2019

Proclamation

Whereas.

During the past year, the American Red Cross responded to mudslides in California, a volcano in Hawaii, wildfires in Colorado and California, destructive hurricanes in Florida and the Carolinas, and a devastating typhoon in U.S. territories. Thousands of American Red Cross volunteers provided around-the-clock shelter for disaster victims, served millions of meals and snacks with partners, and distributed millions of relief items.

Whereas.

In West Virginia, the Red Cross has a long history of helping our neighbors in need. In the past year, they assisted 1,057 families who experienced a local disaster, over 800 of which were devastating home fires.
