Where there isn't a "need", why are we making an exception? 2) When such businesses are about to be built, and it affects neighboring properties, why aren't residents contacted and at least given the opportunity to speak out against it at your meetings? I know a neighbor directly across from this site who was not notified. 3) This not only affects my friend and other's property values along Waverly Rd., but it affects her safety, and the safety of others who will be traveling that road. It is a terrible idea to place a business in the middle of a turn like this. 4) Video gaming is associated with drinking. Drinking and driving along that road is an accident waiting to happen. 5) A similar facility that would have been placed within city limits and operated out of Davinci's was recently shot down. If the people of Williamstown were supportive of a venture such as this, they would have supported the long-time business owner of Davinci's in her effort to add gaming to her business. Placing a facility just out of city limits flies in the face of what the people of Williamstown want and would deem appropriate. It feels exactly like these efforts have been back-doored. 6) Please don't forget about the addition of a new kayaking launch at the wildlife refuge out Waverly Rd past this location. This will likely add to an increase in traffic out that way. It is already a road commonly traveled by cyclists, outdoorsmen and campers. Let's not add a bar/gaming site to this mix.

I'd like to ask that you reconsider this variance, or at the very least call a public hearing to hear feedback from the residents this will directly affect.

I was given this email address as a way to voice my concern for a gambling place very close to my home, just outside Williamstown city limits.

I believe that if the owner of said tract had contacted any of the people living near there, besides a rental company, they would have found we are not happy with this venture. I'll assume that's why NONE of us were asked. This is a residential area and we would like to keep it that way. Many of us have children and more traffic and out of state people coming through is not wanted by our HOMES. Our city and our community gain absolutely NOTHING from this place. There are NO positives in this, in more ways than one. I'd like to know how many Board Members would approve a gambling establishment just steps from their front door?? Also, I can only imagine the negative effect to our property values.

Most notably, let's be real here, I cannot for the life of me figure out how this is even plausible. That parcel is a hillside, with train tracts going through the middle, and the lower half is a land locked flood zone. Where would a building be built? What about parking? They're going to need a septic tank and leach field also, as none of us have city sewer. Even if they could build it on the flood zone part, CSX is not going to let a business have customers crossing their tracts. (Ask the guy who built the sternwheel place on Route 14 near the end of Henderson Avenue in Williamstown about it. He learned the hard way, AFTER he built, that CSX wasn't going to allow it.) Not to mention, if they ever need a police officer, they're going to have to wait for a Sheriff. So let's just nip this terrible idea in the bud and stop it now, please. There are other Commercial properties for this.

Only weeks ago, Williamstown voted down the addition of more gambling machines to a very prominent member of our own town. This should not be ANY different.



We are severely concerned about the gambling facility being built on Waverly Road in Williamstown. My house is located less than 500 ft from the location and at NO time have we been contacted about the variance. Following are our concerns:

- 1. The safety of our children. We have two children ages 10 and 12 that play outside daily. The facility is looking to build less than 400 ft from our trampoline and basketball hoop. The increase of traffic and the location of the facility in the blind turn are a deep concern for their safety. The turn has been the sight to many accidents already. Including the accident that killed my uncle. Pulling out of our driveway is dangerous now, before adding additional traffic and obstacles from the Gambling facility. We are deeply concerned for our children's safety and the safety of others in our neighborhood.
- 2. The value of our property. We have worked very hard since 2009 when we purchased our home to increase the value of our property. 
