BUSINESS: Prayer by Brian Arthur.

A) Moved by Dave Steele, seconded by Lee Johnson that the minutes of the Board meeting of April 5 meeting be approved. Passed unanimously.

EXISTING SEWER PLANT DEMOLITION, ETC.:

A) Ron continues to work on maintenance of Hyview Terrace Plant.

B) The District received a Draft Order from the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) in reference to the Lubeck Hills sewer problem. They are proposing a fine of \$25,000. I am to meet with the DEP on May 25th. We are hoping to be able to talk them into lowering the fine down to \$2,000 - \$2,500 and have them go after Shamrock for criminal charges on their own.

DISCUSSION OF DISTRICT HAPPENINGS:

It was reported what has been happening in the District:

- A) Installed 3 water taps since the last Board meeting. There are 10 water taps to be installed. This gives us 16 water taps for 2001. The District has installed 2 sewer taps since the last Board meeting. There are 0 sewer taps to be installed. This gives us 4 sewer tap for 2001.
- B) Installed new meter bench in basement of water plant. As soon as we get it approved by the Public Service Commission we will be able to test 16 meters at a time.
- C) Worked on water leak today.
- D) Extended sewer lines in Conger, Blennerhassett Heights, and DuPont Manor.
- E) Completed work orders, spotted lines, set meters.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

- A) Received a thank you note from Stafford McQuillin for the donation in memory of his wife.
- B) The District has received the results from another round of testing for the C-8. It appears that the amount is increasing however, the chemists maintain that in this minuscule a concentration, the results are the same.

- C) Moved by Lee Johnson, seconded by Dave Steele that the March 2001 financial statement as prepared by Philip R. Postlewait, Jr., CPA be accepted. Passed unanimously. Also, see attached Schedule of Cash.
- D) Moved by Dave Steele, seconded by Lee Johnson that all bills be approved as reviewed by management and the Board, in addition to all fund transfers as presented. Passed unanimously.
- E) The power company is pushing the use of surge suppressers on our system. They have given Jim information to review.
- F) Mike and Edwin Hill attended the meeting asking about two (2) pieces of property that Edwin Hill owns in Lubeck. Holley Brothers has yet to finalize the restoration of his property and he was trying to get some help from the Board. Jim and Brian to look into the problems and try and get them resolved.
- G) Meeting adjourned.
