BUSINESS: Prayer by Jim Smith.

A) Moved by Dave Steele, seconded by Jim Smith that the minutes of the Board meeting of October 9, 2003 be approved. Passed unanimously.

EXISTING PACKAGE PLANT DEMOLITION & LINE REHABILITATION:

- A) Charlie and Mark continues to work on operation and maintenance of the Hyview Terrace Plant.
- B) The Wakefield plant has been removed but we need to bring in a lot of fill dirt to bring it back up to the original ground level. The District will be working on completing this over the next few weeks.

DISCUSSION OF DISTRICT HAPPENINGS:

It was reported what has been going on in the District:

- A) Installed 3 water taps since the last Board meeting. There is 1 water tap to be installed. This gives us 62 water taps for 2003. The District has installed 1 sewer tap since the last Board meeting. There is 1 sewer tap to be installed. This gives us 13 sewer taps for 2003.
- B) Moved 4 water taps on Pleasant Hill Road due to a new home being built and them wanting their driveway where the taps were located.
- C) Replaced setter on New England Ridge due to bad setter.
- D) Repaired on leak in Bickel Estates.
- E) Completed work orders, spotted lines, set meters.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

- A) Moved by Dave Steele, seconded by Jim Smith that all bills be approved as reviewed by management and the Board, in addition to all fund transfers as presented. Passed unanimously.
- B) Discussion of water rate increase.
- C) Signing of paper work for the potential funding of the \$1,968,000 from the Rural Utilities Services. The interest rate for this loan would be 5% if we can get the loan. Moved by Dave Steele, seconded by Jim Smith that the District apply for the loan to replace the Water Development loan. Passed unanimously.

- D) The Board needs to go into Executive Session. Pursuant to 6-9A-4 of the Open Governmental Statue, an executive session of the District's board is necessary to discuss the sale or lease of property, Section # 9, which, if made public, might adversely affect the financial or other interest of the state or any political subdivision. Moved by Dave Steele, seconded by Jim Smith that the Board go into Executive Session for discussion of matters recited above. Passed unanimously.
- E) It was declared by Jim Smith upon returning from Executive Session that no decisions had been made or would be make. Passed unanimously.
- F) Rick Olcott was here from the Pahlhurst Homeowner's Association to thank the District for the removal of the old sewer plant and pond. He also asked if the District had a problem with the Association planting some trees on that property. He was told that the District did not have a problem with that but that it was at their own risk.
- G) Meeting adjourned.
