Lubeck Public Service District Meeting - May 8, 2025

- · Meeting called to order.
- Approval of board meeting minutes for April 24, 2025.
 - Dave Lawson made a motion to approve.
 - Jerry Martin seconded.
 - Motion carries unanimously.

Discussion of District Happenings

- Water and Sewer Tap Updates:
 - One water tap installed since last meeting.
 - Two water taps waiting to be installed.
 - No sewer taps installed or waiting.
 - 11 water taps installed this year, no sewer taps.
- Work Completed:
 - Work orders completed: spotted lines and set meters.
 - Repaired two service line leaks and one mainline leak.
 - Repaired yards and road on Judy Street (sewer issue).
 - Repaired blacktop, started flushing hydrants, cleaned sand filter.
- Bid Openings for 2013 Ford F150 Short Bed:
 - Quentin Brady: \$1200
 - Trent: \$850
 - Russell: \$750
 - Quentin is the highest bidder.

• Quentin needs to check by Monday. If not, the next bidder will be contacted.

Approval Payments and Bills and Transfers

Fairlawn Project

- Progress: All lines are in the ground, reclamation in progress.
- · Line charged this morning, hydro testing this afternoon.
- Reclamation should be finished by the middle of next week if weather permits.
- Pay application will be submitted at the next meeting after pressure test and chlorination.
 - Quantities and footages will be reviewed and approved.
 - Zach Dobbins is the admin on this.
 - Contractors will be paid 90% initially, with the remainder after documentation and blacktop work.

New England Ridge Water

- Meeting set for May 22nd at 7 p.m. at the office for customer sign-up for water.
- Addresses for mailing were obtained from the Internet and water testing results showing PFAs.
 - Mailings were sent out on Monday.
 - Goal is to get residents to sign an agreement or petition stating their need for water due to bad wells.
- Supporting documentation will be compiled into a report for Charleston, which is the only hope for grant money.
 - "They're not going to give a million dollars in grant money if they don't see any people actually wanting water, because it's kind of an extension to unserved."

- There is leftover money from another project that might be a selling point to residents.
- The plan is to give the best effort, knock on doors, and let Charleston decide.
 - If the grant isn't enough, they will consider using the leftover money to start from the other end and extend the water line as far as possible.
- A separate project involving two girls is being planned.
 - They will design it in-house after assessing the location and doing water modeling.

Lubeck Elementary School

- The school board approved the Lubeck Elementary School project. They are going to start moving dirt.
- Advertisements for a right-of-way agent were sent out, but no responses were received initially.
- Kevin Watkins and Todd Swanson were contacted, and they reached out to others.
 - PAS Investments was the only one to respond.
- A motion to accept PAS Investments as the land agent for the school board project was made by Jerry Martin and seconded by Dave Lawson.
- The cost for rights-of-way will not exceed \$10,000, using money from the school project.
