



Summary of Farm Bill Progress in West Virginia

Between 2003 and 2022, over \$91,600,000 has been spent purchasing permanent conservation easements on significant agricultural land in West Virginia. Between county, state, and federal programs (on the Farm Bill side, these include FRPP and ACEP/ALE), **over 300 farms comprising 43,500 acres of land** have been permanently protected. The following chart highlights the contributions from various funding entities.



Farm Bill easement programs have purchased easements in **14 counties**¹, mainly in the eastern portion of the state. These counties amount for most of the agricultural production in the state. According to the 2017 Census of Agriculture, the **14 counties produced \$494,442,000**, (or 65%) in agricultural products, against a total of **\$754,279,000 for the entire state**. Of the 20 counties with active farmland protection boards, the 14 cited are able to leverage USDA/NRCS funds due to lack of severed minerals. The more central/western counties with programs are limited in their ability to participate in Farm Bill easement programs because of severed mineral rights.

¹ These counties are Berkeley, Fayette, Grant, Greenbrier, Hampshire, Hardy, Jefferson, Mineral, Monroe, Morgan, Nicholas, Pocahontas, Preston, and Summers.

Land Protection in WV – Who are We?

- County farmland protection boards (FPBs) are the primary entities who assist landowners to voluntarily protect their farmland
- The West Virginia Agricultural Land Protection Authority provides support to the county FPBs as well as landowners in non-FPB counties.
- Other partners include numerous West Virginia land trusts; the state-level entity, The Outdoor Heritage Conservation Fund; the WV Association of Farmland Protection Boards; other multi-state private land conservation organizations; and state and Federal governmental departments and programs.
- Local and state efforts, along with Federal matching monies help us protect West Virginia's farmland

Accomplishments in WV

- Conservation easement law – 1995; first public boards 2000; county funding 2002; state funding 2008. We have accomplished much in 25 years of public funding.
- 20 county farmland protection boards with local transfer tax funding -- the Association of Farmland Protection Boards represents the interests of those boards
- Through December 2024 the farmland protection effort has protected approximately 49,000 acres through perpetual conservation easements.
- We have successfully leveraged \$31 million of USDA-NRCS Federal conservation easement program funds and over \$2 million of American Battlefield Protection monies to date. This \$31million in Federal funds means that for each state and local dollar, we have obtained 43 cents in matching Federal monies.





Resolution in Support of the I-68 Energy Manufacturing Corridor

Whereas, the **West Virginia Route 2 and Interstate 68 Authority** was established by the West Virginia State Legislature on April 12, 1997, with the passage of House Bill 2539 and signed by Governor Cecil Underwood on May 2, 1997; and

Whereas, the extension of Interstate 68 from its junction with I-79 near Morgantown, West Virginia to West Virginia Route 2 at Kent, West Virginia has been sought after even before the creation of the Authority; and

Whereas, the Shale Crescent USA region in Ohio, West Virginia and Pennsylvania is the premiere low-cost manufacturing region in the world; and

Whereas, the project to extend Interstate 68 has the potential to accelerate private and government revenues and create thousands of jobs from the Shale Crescent; and

Whereas, President Trump's administration during his first term in office supported this project by working with and holding meetings with Bob Miller, Jr., as a West Virginia Marshall County Commissioner in 2017, and then in his current role as the Executive Director of the West Virginia Route 2 and Interstate 68 Authority; and

Whereas, the White House arranged meetings with the United States Department of Transportation, Department of Commerce, and the Department of Energy in Washington, DC under President Trump's first term to expedite this project; and

Whereas, this project would play a major role in accomplishing President Trump's mission to create conditions for economic growth and opportunity; and

Whereas, the extension of Interstate 68 has never been more important than now; so

Therefore, be it resolved that the Wood County fully supports and urges the Trump White House, Governor Patrick Morrisey, the West Virginia State Legislature, and representatives of both State and Federal government bodies to do everything in their power to secure funding to extend and build the "I-68 ENERGY MANUFACTURING CORRIDOR" from the junction with Interstate 79 near Morgantown, West Virginia, to WV Route 2 at Kent, West Virginia, then across the Ohio River to Clarington, Ohio, to Interstate 77 near Caldwell, Ohio, and eventually westward to Interstate 75 between Dayton and Middletown, Ohio.

The West Virginia (WV) Route 2/I-68 Authority (The Authority), as you may know, is a non-profit Authority organized for the purposes set forth in West Virginia Legislative House Bill 2539, dated April 12, 1997. These include the promotion, development, and advancement of the prosperity and economic welfare of *Brooke, Hancock, Marion, Marshall, Monongalia, Ohio, Pleasants, Tyler, Wetzel, and Wood* (member) counties, its citizens, and industrial complex. September 2025




Whereas on May 22, 2023 Grove Bank and Trust accepted receipt of said funds subject to instructions by the Personal Representative as authorized by Court Order.


Upon mature consideration, and the stipulation of the parties, the court and does hereby find and order:
