IN THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF WOOD COUNTY, WEST VIRGINIA IN RE: Minutes of the Meeting held August 18, 1981

> PRESENT: President, Holmes R. Shaver Commissioner, William C. Parrish Commissioner, Dexter L. Buckley, Jr.

At 10:00 a.m. the Commission witnessed a hearing upon the resignation of an executor in the estate of Harley Conley Jr. Upon hearing the testimony of various witnesses it appears to this Commission that a problem does in fact occur in the financial accounting of the estate. Commission President, Holmes R. Shaver, stated that he felt the parties involved should meet with Mr. George Lantz (Commissioner of Accounts) to resolve the problem and get back in touch with the Commission to continue and resolve the matter.

At 11:10a.m. the Commission met with Assessor, Eugene A: Knotts and Mr. Luke Briggs, Marketing & Sales Representative, from I.B.M. The purpose of the meeting was to request the purchase of three (3) new I.B.M. key-punch machines for the Assessor/Sheriff's Office. The Commission upon the motion of Commissioner William C. Parrish, seconded by Commissioner Dexter L. Buckley Jr. and made unanimous by Commission President, Holmes R. Shaver unanimously agreed to accept the Lease Agreement of I.B.M. for the rental of the aformentioned machines at a monthly charge of \$785.00 of which will include maintenance. Mr. Briggs stated that the approximate cost to purchase the machines would be 15,000.00.

Also, upon the motion of Commissioner William C. Parrish seconded by Commissioner Dexter L. Buckley, Jr., and made unanimous by Commission President, Holmes R. Shaver, it was ORDERED that due to the fact that their exists an emergency; it was unanimously agreed by this Commission that the proposal submitted from Schneider Construction Company be and is hereby approved and accepted in the total amount of \$8,200.00 to repair and secure a top center stone on the Market Street side of the Wood County Court House. A copy of this ORDER is in attachment.

Also, upon the motion of Commissioner William C. Parrish, seconded by Commissioner Dexter L. Buckley, Jr., and made unanimous by Commission President, Holmes R. Shaver it is the unanimous decision of this Commissio to participate in a program in the area of Alcohol and Speed Enforcement allowing for law enforcement overtime on an 80/20 match, with the total project being \$6,240.00, of which this Commission's share is \$1,248.00, for the period of October 1, 1981, through September 30, 1982. The authorizing official will be Commission President, Holmes R. Shaver; the Project Director, Sheriff, L. W. Bechtold and the Financial Officer, H. K. Smith, County Clerk. RESOLUTION, WHEREAS, the County of Wood, State of West Virginia, acting by and through the Wood County Commission is a governmental body created by the Constitution and Laws of the State of West Virginia, has been advised by financial institutions transacting business in the County of Wood that there exists a substantial shortage of financial resources to finance multi-family mortgage loans for the construction of Multi-Family Rental Projects in the County. With the first series of such bond(s) to be in the principal amount of up to \$25,000,000.00 and with the proceeds of the Bonds, after the payment of expenses of issuance and the establishment of any required reserves, to be made available through financial institutions transacting business in the County as multi-family mortgage loans. A RESOLUTION WITH RESPECT TO ISSUANCE OF MULTI-FAMILY LOANS-TO-LENDERS MORTGAGE REVENUE BONDS BY THE COUNTY OF WOOD , STATE OF WEST VIRGINIA

WHEREAS, The County of Wood , State of West Virginia, (the "County") acting by and through The County Commission of County, West Virginia, (the "Commission"), is a governmental Wood body created by the Constitution and Laws of the State of West Virginia and empowered and authorized by the Industrial Development and Commercial Development Bond Act (Chapter 13, Article 2C, Section 1, et seq., of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended (the "Act"), among other things, to finance residential real property for family units by making secured loans to other to provide funds for the acquisitions, by purchase, construction, lease or otherwise of multi-family rental projects for families of limited income ("Multi-Family Rental Projects"), and to issue revenue bonds ("Bonds") pursuant to the Act to provide funds to finance such Multi-Family Rental Projects; and,

WHEREAS, the Commission has been advised by financial institutions transacting business in this County that there exists a substantial shortage of financial resources to finance multi-family mortgage loans for the construction of Multi-Family Rental Projects in the County, that because of this shortage of funds such loans either are not available at all, or to the limited extent available necessitate such a high interest cost that a shortage of decent, safe and sanitary housing exists for families of limited income in the County, that proceeds from the issuance of Bonds pursuant to the Act could be effectively administered through financial institutions transacting business in the County to substantially meet the needs for multi-family mortgage loans to finance Multi-Family Rental Projects in amounts and at interest rates which families with incomes, after taking into account family size and other relevant factors, below the highest income levels could afford to live in and thereby provide multi-family mortgage loans not now available to meet the needs for Multi-Family Rental Projects for such families; and,

WHEREAS, the investment banking firms of Baker, Watts & Co. and Newman and Associates, Inc. (the "Underwriters") have advised the Commission that subject to the continuance of suitable market and related conditions the Underwriters are willing to undertake the offering of such Bonds by the County and the development of related required structuring of such a transaction as is requisite for the security and payment of such Bonds and the making of needed multi-family mortgage loans for Multi-Family Rental Projects situate within the County from the proceeds thereof; and,

WHEREAS, the Commission is desirous of exercising its full powers and authorities under the Act to the end that insofar as feasible persons and families living within or desiring to live within the County have available to them mortgage financing for sanitary, safe and decent housing.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by The County Commission of Wood County, West Virginia:

 Based upon information submitted by and in behalf of financial institutions transacting business in the County, it is hereby found and determined that:

(a) There is a substantial shortage of financial resources to finance multi-family mortgage loans for the construction of sanitary, decent and safe housing in the County, and that the shortage is particularly acute with respect to multi-family housing for families with incomes, after taking into account family size and other relevant factors, below the highest income levels,

(b) That private and public lenders making loans within the County have not been able to meet this need from sources currently available to them and that proceeds from the issuance and sale of Bonds pursuant to the Act could be effectively administered through financial institutions transacting business in the County to substantially meet the needs for multi-family mortgage loans in amounts and at interest rates which would be feasible for families with incomes, depending upon family size and other relevant factors, pelow the highest income levels to afford and thereby provide nousing not now available to meet the needs for Multi-Family Rental 'rojects in the County for such families.

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(c) That the County, through the Underwriters, subject to the continuance of suitable market and related conditions would be able to sell such Bonds and make the proceeds available for the making of such needed multi-family mortgage loans for Multi-Family Rental Projects situate within the County, and,

(d) That the sale of Bonds and utilization of the proceeds thereof, for the making of such multi-family mortgage loans in the County to finance Multi-Family Rental Projects to provide sanitary, decent and safe housing would constitute the fulfillment of a public purpose and improve and otherwise promote the health and welfare of the residents of the County.

2. The President and the Clerk of this Commission are hereby authorized and directed to prepare, execute and deliver to the Underwriters the written commitment of this Commission that, subject to the final approval by this Commission of definitive documents, instruments and other writings, prepared, or caused to be prepared by the Underwriters, and by Messrs. McKittrick and Vaughan, of St. Albans, West Virginia, and Hamb, Poffenbarger and Williams, of Charleston, West Virginia, Co-Bond Counsel, the County, acting by and through this Commission, will issue and offer through the Underwriters, in one or more series, at such time or times and in such amounts as the Commission shall approve, Multi-Family Loans to Lenders Mortgage Revenue Bonds (the "Bonds") of this County with the first series of such Bonds to be in the principal amount of up to \$25,000,000. and with the proceeds of the Bonds, after the payment of expenses of issuance and the establishment of any required reserves, to be made available through financial institutions transacting business in the County as multi-family mortgage loans for the construction of Multi-Family Rental Projects in this County for occupancy by families earning a family income depending upon family size and other relevant factors, up to a specified income level as determined to be necessary and appropriate by this Commission at the time of the issuance of the Bonds, it being specifically understood that, as provided by the Act, such commitment shall be subject to the following special conditions:

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(a) If the other events contemplated hereby which would provide a source for reimbursement thereof do not take place, the Underwriters agree that they will reimburse the Commission for or pay all reasonable and necessary direct out-of-pocket expenses, if any, which the Commission may incur at the Underwriters' request arising from the execution and delivery of the above-described commitment of the Commission and the performance by the Commission of its obligations thereunder.

(b) It is understood and agreed by and between the Commission and the Underwriters that the provisions of this resolution and of the commitment referred to herein are not intended to, and shall not be construed or interpreted to, either (a) obligate, or authorize the expenditure of, any funds or monies of the County derived from any source whatsoever other than the proceeds from issuance and sale of the Bonds as provided for in this resolution and in said commitment and any other monies arising from the multi-family mortgage loans made with the proceeds thereof, the investment of any reserves therefrom, or otherwise from the Multi-Family Rental Projects financed therewith, or (b) create any personal liability of any officer or member of the Commission or any official or employee of the County, present or future.

3. This resolution shall take effect immediately, and be effective for six (6) months from the date of this resolution.
