Janitorial Specifications for Wood County Commission Correctional Center Wood County Courthouse Magistrates Offices

- General The contractor shall furnish all labor, supplies (excluding personal and disposable restroom supplies, hand soaps, sanitary napkins, and plastic trash can liners), materials, equipment, supervision and perform satisfactory the services at the frequencies and during the times as specified herein. The services shall include all functions normally considered a part of workmanlike satisfactory janitorial work.
  - A. Daily Five (5) times per week.
    - The contents of ashtrays and smoking stands shall be emptied and ashtrays wiped clean.
    - 2. Wastebaskets and trash recepticals shall be emptied.
    - 3. Remove all trash, debris and rubbish from the building to a pick up point designated by the Buildings manager for removal from the premises by others.
    - 4. Horizontal surfaces of desks, shall be dusted and glass table tops spot cleaned.
    - Main entrances shall be policed. Sweep and/or vaccum full floor areas. Hard floor areas shall be wet mopped.
    - 6. All entrance glass shall be cleaned on both sides.
    - 7. Clean and sanitize all toliet rooms and refill dispensers (from customer's stock)

#### WOOD COUNTY 4-H CAMP - BUTCHER BEND

On Monday afternoon, June 8, 1981, Mr. James Bailey, Wood County Extension Agent, Freddie Fields, DC, Soil Conservation Service, and I studied the water problems on the Wood County 4-H Camp on Butcher Bend Road.

The problem area joins the Butcher Bend Road on the South and West of the access road to the camp facilities. The soil on the problem area is Tygart Silt Loam. This soil is fairly wet terrace and lower slope soils with tight, clayey subsoils. It has a seasonal high water table and is subject to ponding.

In our discussion on the site, we discussed land shaping, waterways, open ditch drainage and subsurface drainage. A combination of all of these may be required to properly drain the area. However, after a closer study of the use of the area, the characteristics of the soil, and the lay of the land, the major operation needed is subsurface or tile drainage. Some smoothing and shaping will be needed to prevent ponding. There is estimated to be approximately 6.0 acres that will need to be established in vegetation.

A topographic survey and map of the area is needed to determine what practices can be installed to best take care of the water problem.

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
