Purchase Order #5989, to Parkersburg Printing, in the amount of \$1,155.00, for the Tax Department.


Purchase Order #5990, to Parkersburg Office Supply, in the amount of \$15.12, for the Circuit Clerk's Office.

Purchase Order #5991, to Byers Lock & Key, in the amount of \$1.40, for the Correctional Center.


Purchase Order #5993, to PA. & W.V. Supply, in the amount of \$33.60, for the Correctional Center.
