IN RE: Minutes of the Meeting held Oct., 6, 1983

This day the Commission witnessed the swearing in of Raymond E. Leach, Mayor of Williamstown, to the Wood County Development Authority, to fill unexpired term of Mayor Marvin Fischer.

Also this day, the Commission received a Court ORDER permitting the transfer of six prisoners to the Kanawha County jail for a period not to exceed two weeks while emergency remodeling is being done at the Wood County Correctional Center. Copy of Order attached.

A public hearing, pursuant to Internal Revenue code, was held in reference to the issuance of commercial revenue bonds for MCKY & Associates, in the amount of \$800,000. Proceeds are to be used toward acquisition and remodeling of building and parking located at 6th and Avery. Attending were Larry Morehead, Building Manager for MCKY & Associates. Bill Pfalzgraf, counsel for Development Authority, conducted the meeting, and said that the Commission would not have to take any action immediately but will be presented with the final bond resolution within 30 days. After ascertaining that there was no one present with any objections, meeting was adjourned at 10:47 a.m.

Pat Minnite came before the Commission with two prices for work on catwalk handrails at the Wood County Correctional Center. Arcon, Inc., submitted the price of \$4,750; Litton Fabricators submitted \$3,234. Commissioner Shaver will contact Litton in the near future to let them know when to start work.







In Re: Temporary Placement of Wood County Prisoners in Kanawha County Jail During Repairs to Wood County Jail

This day appeared the Wood County Commission by Prosecuting Attorney, HARRY G. DEITZLER, and informed the Court that emergency repairs of the Wood County Jail (Correctional Center) will commence forthwith and it is necessary to adopt the jail of another county for certain dangerous inmates held therein until sufficient jail is obtained by said repairing, pursuant to the West Virginia Code section 7-8-1. The Commission further informed the Court that the inmates aforesaid are Richard Abbott, Charles Grove, Danny Montgomery, Randall Donahue, Harold Blevins and Ralph DeBerry. The Commission further informed the Court that Sheriff L.W. Bechtold had made arrangements with the Kanawha County Jailer to house said prisoners, with the Court's approval, during the term of said repairs which is estimated to be less than two weeks and the costs to the Wood County Commission will be \$17.00 per day for each prisoner so housed.

Wherefore, the Court finds that pursuant to section 7-8-1 of the West Virginia Code it is necessary to adopt the Kanawha County Jail to house Richard Abbott, Charles Grove, Danny Montgomery, Randall Donahue, Harold Blevins and Ralph DeBerry until sufficient jail is obtained by repairing as proposed by the Wood County Commission.

It is therefore ORDERED that the prisoners aforesaid be transported and housed in the Kanawha County Jail for a period not to exceed two weeks and that upon completion of repairs designated by the
