At 9:15 new Correctional Officer, Camille S. Waldron was sworn in.





The allocated ambulances are operated by various agencies in Wood County and are allocated as follows:

Camden-Clark Memorial Hospital Ambulance Service operates five (5) allocated ambulances.

St. Joseph's Hospital Ambulance Service operates five (5) allocated ambulances.

Pond Creek Volunteer Fire Department operates one (1) four wheel drive ambulance in Southern Rural Wood County.

Washington Bottom Volunteer Fire Department operates one (1) ambulance in Southeastern Wood County.

Williamstown Emergency Ambulance Service operates one (1) ambulance in Northwestern Wood County.

The ambulances that are marked with the asteriks on the ambulance listing are those that are allocated and are essential for service in Wood County.

BACK-UP RESOURCES

No formal Mutual Aid Agreement exist with these counties, however, they will respond as back-up units. A Region Wide Disaster Response Table is in existance for mutual responses.

IN RE: Charges allowed by Fiduciary Commissioners.

Dear Mr. Hague:

At the January 1985 Session of the West Virginia Legislature, April 9, 1985, Chapter 44, Article 2, Section 1, of the West Virginia Code, pertaining to Charges in Estates by Fiduciary Commissioners was amended, to become effective July 1, 1985. Said amendment limited the amount to be charged in estates by Fiduciary Commissioners to Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars, unless the charges that exceed that amount can be justified; however, Richard E. Boyle, Jr., Director Inheritance Tax Division, has waived the Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars limitation for the October Term Settlements, the Wood County Commission concurring therein.


Beginning with the January, 1986 Term Settlements, and all subsequent settlements made by Fiduciary Commissioners, the Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars limitation will apply.

If you have any Settlements in Estates wherein the charges exceed the statutory Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars limitation, please see that such Settlements are accompanied by an explanation in writing to justify the charges.

O R D E R

This 19th day of December, 1985, came GEORGE SHEDAN, CHARLES V. RENNER, GEORGE E. LANTZ and EUGENE T. HAGUE, JR., the Fiduciary Commissioners of Wood County, West Virginia, concerning a letter from this Commission dated October 3, 1985, pertaining to charges in estates by fiduciary commissioners under the provisions of Chapter 44, Article 2, Section 1 of the West Virginia Code.

Whereupon, the Commission heard the argument from the Fiduciary Commissioners concerning the application of the aforesaid Code Section as amended. And, after hearing said arguments and after mature consideration of the same, it appears to the Commission as follows:

1. That the recent amendment to Chapter 44, Article 2, Section 1 of the West Virginia Code became effective July 1, 1985.
2. That the amendment to the aforesaid Code Section changed the existing law by increasing from \$25,000.00 to \$50,000.00 the exemption for references to fiduciary commissioners and further limited the charges to be made by fiduciary commissioners without approval of the county commission.
3. That the Director of the Inheritance Tax Division of the West Virginia State Tax Department has requested the Commission to give retroactive effect to the July 1, 1985

amendment to the aforesaid Code Section insofar and insofar only as the same applies to limitations on the fees charged by fiduciary commissioners by applying the limitation to final settlements filed with the Commission beginning January 1986, without regard to the date of reference to the fiduciary commissioner.

4. That to follow the directive of the State Tax Department would be confusing and disruptive to the orderly administration of estates in this county and would be improper and possibly illegal.

It is therefore ORDERED that the provisions of Chapter 44, Article 2, Section 1 of the West Virginia Code which was amended and became effective July 1, 1985, shall apply to estates referred to the fiduciary commissioners after the effective date of the amendment.


