IN RE: MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD JULY 8, 1985

PRESENT: PRESIDENT, DEXTER L. BUCKLEY, JR.
COMMISSIONER, HOLMES R. SHAVER

This day the County Commission convened in regular session at 9:00 a.m. The first order of business was daily business with County Administrator Mary Rader.

At 10:00 Attorney Richard Bush representing Cassandra Marie Cochran petitioned the Commission to have Ms. Cochran's natural father, William I. Cochran appointed her legal guardian of person and estate in place of Pamela Dils, Ms. Cochran's natural aunt who is presently serving in that capacity. It was noted that Mrs. Dils has not yet filed an appraisal of Ms. Cochran's estate. Cassandra was questioned by Attorney Bush. She stated that she understood the proceedings and it is her desire that her natural father be appointed her legal guardian. She testified that she is 15 years of age, her birthdate being March 12, 1970. Mrs. Dils was not present, but represented by Attorney Robert Tebay, present. He stated that Mrs. Dils has no objection to these proceedings. Mrs. Dils is under bond and Commissioner Shaver said that that bond should continue until the final appraisal of the estate is filed. A motion was made by Commissioner Shaver that William I. Cochran be appointed legal guardian for Cassandra Marie Cochran. Commissioner Guinn seconded and President Buckley made the vote unanimous. Mr. Cochran was required to post a \$100 bond. A hearing date of July 29, 1985 at 10:00 a.m. was set to finalize the paper work for the estate.

Today Ruth D. Nonamaker was appointed Honorary Deputy Assessor for Wood County for the purpose of selling Dog Licenses in the City of Vienna.

Today the Commission named Michael Daugherty to the Board of Directors of the Parkersburg/Wood County Visitors & Convention Bureau. He will represent and report to the County Commission on this Board.


Attorney Beth Pyles petitioned the Commission for her client, Jack F. Arthur, asking the Commission to declare his mother, Eurette Sweet, legally incompetent. Mr. Arthur testified that his mother resides at the Park View Health Care Center. She has for the past few years suffered from Alzheimer's Disease, and cannot care for herself or her financial affairs. She owns no real property but has an interest in a deceased son's estate. Mrs. Sweet was present at the hearing. Commissioner Shaver moved that Mrs. Sweet be found incompetent, Commissioner Guinn seconded and President Buckley made the vote unanimous. The Commission then appointed Jack F. Arthur Committee for his mother and set bond at \$10,000.


The Commission sent a letter to the State Tax Department today asking the Legal Division for an opinion as to whether or not organizations who receive Federal or State funding could be exempt from the Hotel/Motel Occupancy Tax. The Commission imposed the tax today and designated allocations for the money. Copies of the Orders are attached.

O R D E R

WHEREAS, at a regular session of the West Virginia Legislature of 1985, House Bill Number 2090 was passed and duly signed into law by the Governor of the State of West Virginia; and

WHEREAS, Chapter Seven of the West Virginia Code of 1931, as amended, was further amended, by adding thereto a new article designated Article Eighteen; and

WHEREAS, the County Commission of Wood County adopted a RESOLUTION dated May 9, 1985, announcing its intention to enact this Tax;


BE IT THEREFORE ORDERED that the County Commission of Wood County enters into the records that Commissioner Shaver so moves that the County Commission enact the Hotel Occupancy Tax with Commission Guinn seconding and President Buckley making the vote unanimous.

OF FUNDS TO BE COLLECTED FROM THE HOTEL OCCUPANCY
TAX IMPOSED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION AS OF JULY 8,
1985

O R D E R

Pursuant to an ORDER also dated July 8, 1985, in which the County Commission imposed the Hotel Occupancy Tax, enacted by the West Virginia Legislature HB 2090, the County Commission hereby desires to disburse these funds on the following basis:

Convention Bureau	50%
Veterans' Park	2%
Fine Arts Council	5%
Mountwood Park	42%
Parkersburg Homecoming Committee	1 %

These percentages are based on projections supplied to the Commission by Steve Nicely of the Parkersburg/Wood County Visitors & Convention Bureau.

This disbursement was passed on a motion made by Commissioner Shaver, seconded by Commissioner Guinn and made unanimous by President Buckley.
