

IN THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF WOOD COUNTY, WEST VIRGINIA

IN RE: MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD
JUNE 10, 1985

The first order of business for the day was daily business with County Administrator Mary Rader.

At 10:00 Attorney Bill Crichton came before the Commission with a petition to have himself appointed Administrator of the Richard G. Lawton, (deceased) estate. The Administratrix, Mrs. Boyce died last December. The Commission on a unanimous vote appointed Mr. Crichton to be the Administrator of the Richard G. Lawton Estate.

At 11:00 the Commission heard the petition of Mr. Jack Arthur of Davisville, Wood County, to have his mother Mrs. Eurette Sweet declared legally incompetent. Mr. Arthur testified that his mother is residing in the Parkview Nursing Home in Parkersburg. She is a widow. She is suffering from Alzheimer's Disease. She cannot care for herself. She does not own any property, however she has an interest in a car lot in Texas that one of her other sons purchased using some money from CD's that she had at one time. That son is now deceased and his estate is in the process of being settled. Jack Arthur wants to be appointed Committee for his mother so that he can file a claim against that estate in her name. He has one other brother who lives in Kentucky. David Underwood is guardian ad litem in this case. He confirmed Mrs. Sweet's condition. She was disoriented, did not know the names of her children, or the day of the week. Commissioner Shaver moved that Eurette Sweet be declared incompetent, with a second coming from Commissioner Guinn and President Buckley making the vote unanimous. The Commission unanimously voted to appoint Jack Arthur

Committee for his mother, Eoretta Sweet.

At 11:45 the County Commission appointed Roland Coppack to the Wood County Airport Authority. He replaces Mr. Albert T. Watson, who resigned. His term expires July 1, 1985.

At 1:00 p.m. the Commission approved a Resolution for a Bond Issue of \$100,000.00 for Robert K. Tebay for his Country Dairy Store expansion project.

Sheriff Greiner and his Chief Deputy, Bill Hoffman came before the Commission to discuss the condition of one the Escort Stationwagons used for paper processing. Chief Hoffman said the car needs repairs that will total approximately \$1,000. They do not feel the car is worth putting that much into repairs. They also wanted to discuss the Reserve program that can be implemented July 13, 1985. It was explained that the Sheriff's Department has chosen 13 applicants to serve on the Reserves which would be used for paper processing, transporting non-violent mentals, and traffic and crowd control when needed. The County would have to insure the Reserves at \$60.00 per person the first year, and \$30.00 per person after the first year. This would be done through the Sheriff's Association.

Sheriff Greiner also informed the Commission that he had turned over to the Prosecuting Attorney's office, several delinquent tax tickets for prosecution.




Having no further appointments or business, the Commission adjourned
