

IN THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF WOOD COUNTY, WEST VIRGINIA

IN RE: MINUTES OF MEETING HELD  
THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 14, 1991

PRESENT: PRESIDENT STEVEN A. GRIMM

On this date, the County Commission met in regular session. They signed purchase orders, invoices and correspondence. They also approved minutes from October 31, 1991 upon a motion made by Steven A. Grimm, seconded by Jean Grapes and made unanimous by Holmes R. Shaver. Upon a motion made by Steven A. Grimm, and seconded by Jean Grapes, the County Commission approved minutes from November 4, 1991 and November 7, 1991.

At 9:00 A.M., Shawn Pickens was sworn in as a Reserve Deputy.

At 9:15 A.M., the County Commission met with Danny Wilfong, from Foamcoat Roofing and Coating, Inc. to discuss the cleaning of the exterior of the Courthouse. President Grimm asked Mr. Wilfong for his recommendations. Mr. Wilfong has put together a list of his recommendations in a bid package that will be used by the County Commission when they go out to bid. The recommendations are in regard to water repellent and replacing deteriorated parts of the Courthouse. Mr. Wilfong recommends a pre-wash material that will break down the hydrocarbon on the stone. Mr. Wilfong also recommends that the clay tile roof needs to be cleaned and waterproofed. Mr. Wilfong is going to add an addendum to the bid specifications for the cleaning and sealing of the aluminum frames around the windows. Mr. Wilfong also recommends that the specifications require the Contractor to be responsible for redoing the work if the moss or algae grows back within three years. Mr. Wilfong also stated that he would need to add a Bond to the specifications and would return them to the Commission on this date.

At 10:00 A.M., the County Commission opened sealed bids for a copy mach

to be used in the Prosecutor's Attorney's Office. The following bids were received: Quorum Corporation - \$4,850.00, Ricoh Model FT5520 Model; Best Office Machines - \$5,088.14, Sharp SF8570; American Office Systems - \$3,755.00, Lanier Model 3022; Poynter's Business Products - \$5,135.00, Canon NP-3030 Copier; CWS - \$4,999.00, Canon NP-3030 Copier; Hamilton Business Systems - \$5,290.00, Konica 3035 Copying System; NOE Office Equipment - \$5,469.00, Toshiba BD-7910 Copier and Xerox Corporation - \$6,325.00, Xerox 5028ZTAS Copier. Upon a motion made by Holmes R. Shaver, seconded by Jean Grapes and made unanimous by Steven A. Grimm, the County Commission took the bids under advisement.

At 11:00 A.M., the County Commission held a hearing for Phillip M. Tennant, alleged incompetent. Bernard Eugene Tennant, father of Phillip, was the petitioner. Mr. Tennant stated that his son was in an auto accident and is in a coma. Phillip is 23 years old. He cannot take care of his business affairs. Mr. Tennant stated that Phillip is not conscious and according to the Doctor, he won't be for some time. Phillip has a small checking account at First Empire Federal in Morgantown, WV. He has personal property less than \$1,000.00. Mr. Tennant is his closest relative, his mother is deceased. Mr. Bill Richardson, Guardian Ad Litem, visited Phillip and feels that he does need someone to handle his affairs, but would like it to be reviewed after a year, in the case that he comes out of his coma and is capable of handling his affairs. Upon a motion made by Holmes R. Shaver, seconded by Jean Grapes and made unanimous by Steven A. Grimm, the County Commission declared Phillip M. Tennant Incompetent. Upon a motion made by Holmes R. Shaver, seconded by Jean Grapes and made unanimous by Steven A. Grimm, the County Commission appointed Bernard Eugene Tennant as Committee for Phillip Tennant with a minimum justification surety bond of \$100.00.

At 11:30 A.M., the County Commission met with Lon Chenoweth and others to discuss pornography and obscenity in Wood County. They would like an Ordinance passed to stop an adult video/book store in Mineral Wells, as well

as stopping others from coming into Wood County. Chief Dale Wilcox stated that the Sheriff's Department supports the Ordinance and that they have been watching and checking the organization in Mineral Wells. Chief Wilcox stated that they had found out from Marvin Dowler that building permits had not been obtained. Michelle Rusen, Assistant Prosecutor, stated that the Prosecutor's Office is also concerned about this issue. Ms. Rusen stated that the State Code gives the County Commission permission to pass the Ordinance. Ms. Rusen stated that she wanted to research this and check with other counties that have passed such an Ordinance before she advises the County Commission on the legal aspect of this matter. David Sommerville stated that Wood County is having people move in from Washington and is concerned about their first impression when they come here. He also stated that anyone can get pornographic movies in the area video stores. Renee Peerman stated that she is concerned about the children in Wood County. She also stated that reputable and legitimate business are moving in to the area and probably won't want to be next to a pornographic store. Ms. Peerman also asked who would want to take their children to McDonalds with a strip joint next to it. Mildred Marshall stated that the community is eager to pass this Ordinance. Ms. Marshall stated that newspapers used to have x-rated graphic ads and that she called the newspaper office and now you don't see as many graphic ads. She also stated that pornography does victimize women and children. She is also worried about the children. Dick Fox, City Councilman, stated that he does not support the pornography store in Mineral Wells. He told the citizens to keep up their fight because once the pornography stores get in, it's hard to get them out. Brian Harrell stated that there is nothing clean and decent about pornography. He will never indulge in pornography but has to live in a society that does. He stated that pornography will increase the probability of something bad happening. Mr. Harrell showed the Commission some cartoons out of pornographic magazines concerning incest, drug use, homosexuality, etc.

Tom Shriver stated that they are looking to the Commission for help and that pornography peddles perversion. Freddie Haddad stated that he is proud to live in Parkersburg but does not want his grandchildren to be brought up here with all of the pornography around and it is the responsibility of the Commission to clean up the County. James Kerns stated that the number one problem in the U.S. is AIDS. James Kirk stated that he has worked in a bookstore and knows first hand what pornography can do. Mr. Kirk stated that it has ruined his marriage. Rosemary Leach stated that she works with a youth group and that some of the kids are victims of incest and rape. She is asking the Commission to help and stated also that the damage to these children is untold. President Grimm stated that he has received letters from Cracker Barrel and Resource Consultants stating that they are against the pornography store in Mineral Wells. Lon Chenowith presented petitions to the Commission. John Shriver stated that the first mistake was truck stops because if you have money, you can get anything you want. Mr. Shriver stated that it is no coincidence that they want to put this pornography store near the truck stop. Don Rapson stated that they will support the Commission for their decency. Commissioner Shaver stated that they will act on this as soon as they get a legal opinion. Brenda Boggs stated that Lon Chenowith told her that she could not speak at this meeting. President Grimm stated that this was a public meeting and she could say whatever she wanted. Ms. Boggs asked where do you draw the line, once you start censorship, where does it end. She also stated that people's idea of obscenity are all different. President Grimm stated that they will make their decision on the Ordinance based on what they feel is right and what they can do legally. President Grimm also stated that there will be another public meeting in the future. The County Commission was presented various petitions and letters objecting and protesting the Adult Video and Pornography store to be established at the Liberty Truck Stop located in Mineral Wells. Said Presentation was made by Pastor Lon Chenowith

of the Mineral Wells Baptist Fellowship. Michelle Rusen is to research the legal boundaries of formulating an Ordinance concerning this matter. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

The County Commission authorized Steven A. Grimm to sign the Request for Reimbursement in regard to the Drug Control and System Improvement Formula Grant No. 91-DC-076. No expenditures were made by the County during the month of October, 1991. In addition to the Request, the Monthly Progress Report and the Project Financial Report are being submitted to the Criminal Justice and Highway Safety Office. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

The County Commission was in receipt of a Disposal Certificate from First American Trust Company, First American Center, Corporate Trust NA-0801, Nashville, TN. Said Disposal Certificate is in reference to the Wood County, WV, Industrial Development Revenue Bond, Shoney's, Inc. Project, Series 1982 with the total value processed in the amount of \$198,000.00 which reflects a value of \$195,000.00 for nine exchanged registered bonds and a value of \$3,000.00 for twelve paid coupons. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

On this date, the County Commission was in receipt of a Disposal Certificate from Signet Trust company, 7 North Eighth Street, P.O. Box 26311, Richmond, VA. Said Disposal Certificate is in reference to the Wood County, WV, Industrial Development Revenue Bonds, Johns-Manville, Series 1974 issue dated September 1, 1974. The total value is in the amount of \$295,230.00 and reflects one thousand five hundred fourteen paid coupons being shredded. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

On this date, the County Commission ORDERED that a bid be prepared with a legal notice accepting sealed bids for a steel roll up overhead door for the concrete block building being constructed to house the helicopter for the Sheriff's Department. Said Legal Notice will appear in both The Parkersburg News and Sentinel and the bid opening will be held on Thursday, December 12,

1991, at 10:00 A.M. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.






Having no further business to attend to, the County Commission adjourned at 12:00 Noon.
