

IN THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF WOOD COUNTY, WEST VIRGINIA

IN RE: MINUTES OF MEETING HELD  
THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 26, 1991

PRESENT: PRESIDENT STEVEN A. GRIMM  
COMMISSIONER HOLMES R. SHAVER  
COMMISSIONER JEAN GRAPES

On this date, the County Commission met in regular session. They signed purchase orders, invoices and correspondence.

At 9:30 A.M., the County Commission met with Jim Goldsmith from R.D. Wilson Co. and Sons to discuss quotes that were made on sanitary napkin machines. Mr. Goldsmith had called previously and stated that he quoted an old price for the machines. The County Commission agreed to pay \$236.40 per machine. The Commission purchased four machines.

At 10:00 A.M., the County Commission held a hearing for Cary W. Queen, alleged incompetent. Attorney was George Chandler. Guardian Ad Litem was William Crichton, V. Jonathon Queen, son of Cary Queen. Jonathon Queen was sworn in and stated that his father is 57 years old; is in a Veterans Administration Hospital in Clarksburg, WV; there are three other children; he suffers from severe and chronic mental disorder; won't take showers; sometimes gets violent; can't cook for himself; doesn't eat on a regular basis; he was in a nursing home but he left three times and they had to have someone pick him up and he doesn't remember what he's done during the day. Mr. Queen stated that this disease started about 5-6 years ago but seems to be getting worse. Mr. Queen has been paying the doctor bills for his father because he can't do it by himself. They share a checking account with over \$11,000.00 in it. Cary Queen receives \$243.00 per month from Veterans Administration and approximately \$420.00 per month from Social Security; he has no real or personal property. Mr. Queen's daughter, Elizabeth agreed with the Petition. Guardian Ad Litem visited Cary Queen and stated that he

cannot take care of his sanitary needs and that he stands in doorways for hours with out saying anything. Upon a motion made by Holmes R. Shaver, seconded by Jean Grapes and made unanimous by Steven A. Grimm, the County Commission declared Cary W. Queen incompetent. Upon a motion made by Holmes R. Shaver, seconded by Jean Grapes and made unanimous by Steven A. Grimm, the county Commission appointed Jonathon Queen Committee with a corporate surety bond of \$5,000.00.

At 10:30 A.M., the County Commission met with Danny Wilfong from Foamcoat Roofing and Coatings to discuss cleaning the courthouse's sandstone exterior. Mr. Wilfong coordinated the last cleaning in 1982. Mr. Wilfong stated that the water repellent was only warranted for 10 years and a spot test showed that it probably needed cleaned again. Commissioner Grapes stated that algae was growing on the building. Mr. Wilfong stated that newer cleaning products provide more protection now and that the Courthouse job would take a month to six weeks to completed. Commissioner Shaver asked Mr. Wilfong to draw up specifications which could be bid on by any firm that does this type of work. Commissioner Grapes and President Grimm agreed.

At 11:00 A.M., the County Commission held a hearing for Margaret Andrews, alleged incompetent. Attorney was Darren Tallman. Guardian Ad Litem was Joe Brown. James Andrews, grandson of Margaret Andrews was sworn in. Mr. Andrews stated the following: Margaret is in Parkview Health Care Center and has been there for about 10 years; he is the only living relative in Wood County; she has no assets or checking accounts; she receives Social Security which goes directly to Parkview; she is blind; she is 99 years of age; she has no mind; she cannot feed herself and she cannot take care of her business affairs. Guardian Ad Litem Joe Brown visited Margaret Andrews and stated that she did not respond to her name or to anything. Mr. Brown agrees with the petition. Upon a motion made by Holmes R. Shaver, seconded

by Jean Grapes and made unanimous by Steven A. Grimm, the County Commission declared Margaret Andrews incompetent. Upon a motion made by Holmes R. Shaver, seconded by Jean Grapes and made unanimous by Steven A. Grimm, the County Commission appointed James Andrews Committee with a property bond of \$1,000.00.

At 11:30 A.M., Jodi Boylen was sworn in as a member of the Wood County Civil Service Commission for Deputy Sheriff's.

On this date, the County Commission appointed Jeff Devol to the Wood County Parks and Recreation Commission (Mountwood Park) upon a motion made by Jean Grapes, seconded by Holmes R. Shaver, and made unanimous by Steven A. Grimm. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

On this date the County commission awarded the bid for the preparation of an Asbestos Abatement Management Control Plan for the Mid-Ohio Valley Board of Health and the Wood County Child Care Center, upon a motion made by Jean Grapes, seconded by Holmes R. Shaver and made unanimous by Steven A. Grimm. Said motion further stated that the services of analysis for cost of replacement of both facilities be included in the total bid for both facilities of \$3,713.80 which was submitted by Kemron. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

On this date, the County Commission appointed John Powell to the Wood County Civil Service Commission for Correctional Officers upon a motion made by Jean Grapes, seconded by Holmes R. Shaver and made unanimous by Steven A. Grimm. Mr. Powell is a Democrat. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

On this date, Commission Grapes placed Karen Boone, Drug Free Schools Coordinator for Wood County Schools, in nomination for membership on the Wood County Commission on Crime, Delinquency and Correction. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

On this date, it was discovered that Erroneous Assessment No. 1888 on



On this date, the County Commission adopted a Resolution in reference to Budget Revision No. 9 in the General County Fund budget for the fiscal year 1991/1992. Said Request is being submitted to the Department of Tax and Revenue, Charleston, WV. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

Having no scheduled appointments or further business to attend to, the County Commission adjourned at 12:00 Noon.
