IN RE: MINUTES OF MEETING HELD MONDAY, FEBRUARY 1, 1993

On this date, the County Commission met in regular session. They signed purchase orders, invoices and other correspondence. Upon a motion made by Steven A. Grimm, seconded by Holmes R. Shaver and made unanimous by Jean Grapes, the County Commission approved minutes from Thursday, January 28, 1993.

On this date, the County Commission approved Personal Property Impropers for Michelle D. Walton and Unicom Computer Corporation. They also approved an Exoneration for Janet Smith.

At 9:30 A.M., the County Commission opened sealed bids to provide preventive maintenance service for the elevator located in the Wood County Courthouse, for the elevator located in the Wood County Health Department and for the two elevators located in the Wood County Judicial Building. Sealed bids were received from Industrial Elevator Maintenance Co., Inc., P.O. Box 262, Cecil, PA 15321 - \$237.00/Mo. (two inspections) Wood County Courthouse, \$237.00/Mo. (two inspections) Wood County Health Department and \$426.00/Mo. (two inspections) Wood County Judicial Building and from General Elevator Company, Inc., 539 Rochester Road, Pittsburgh, PA 15237-1747 - \$159.00/Mo. Wood County Courthouse, \$159.00/Mo. Wood County Health Department and \$238.00/Mo. Wood County Judicial Building. Upon a motion made by Jean Grapes, seconded by Steven A. Grimm and made unanimous by Holmes R. Shaver, the County Commission took the bids under advisement. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

At 11:00 A.M., the County Commission held a hearing for Mary F. Eaton,

alleged incompetent. Attorney was William Powell. Michael Eaton, son of Mary Eaton was present and stated that he lives in Dallas, Texas; he is a publisher; he was informed on December 18, 1992 that his mother was in the hospital in the intensive care unit; she had gone into convulsions and later went into a coma; she has sugar diabetes; when he visited her home, it was filthy and looked ransacked, she had many sugar foods in her refrigerator and in every room of the home; she can't take care of herself reliably and he wishes to be appointed Guardian for his mother. Commission was in receipt of an affidavit from her doctor which stated that Mrs. Eaton suffers from paranoia schizophrenia, sugar diabetes, eye and liver damage. Guardian Ad Litem, C. Blane Myers stated that she could not be relied upon to care for herself and he agrees with the petition. Upon a motion made by Steven A. Grimm, seconded by Jean Grapes and made unanimous by Holmes R. Shaver, the County Commission declared Mary F. Eaton Incompent. Mr. Eaton stated that his mother has a car worth approximately \$200.00, property worth approximately \$12,000.00-\$15,000.00; her Social Security checks go directly in her bank. Mr. Myers stated that he talked with Mary Eaton and she understands what this hearing is about and she told him that she trusts Michael and wants him to handle her affairs. Upon a motion made by Steven f A. Grimm, seconded by Jean Grapes and made unanimous by Holmes R. Shaver, the County Commission appointed Michael Eaton as Committee for Mary Eaton with a bond of \$1,000.00.

At 2:00 P.M., the County Commission adjourned and met again as the Board of Review and Equalization. Commissioner Grapes met with Charles Cayton to discuss property in Southmore Heights Addition, Tygart District. Commissioner Grapes stated that an Exoneration needed to be done, but would discuss this with President Shaver and Commissioner Grimm before a final decision would be made. The Commission adjourned as the Board of Review and Equalization.

At 3:05 P.M., the County Commission met with Jamie Six, County Clerk to

discuss the letter from Connie Harper, City Clerk of Parkersburg, concerning the changing of district lines. The County Commission will do a legal notice and a public hearing will be held; if there are no objections then they will approve the changes. (A copy of said letter is attached.)

On this date, the County Commission placed Michele Rusen and Sharon Linch in nomination for the Wood County Commission on Crime, Delinquency and Corrections, upon a motion duly made, seconded and passed. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

On this date, the County Commission announced that a vacancy exists on the Wood County Solid Waste Authority. Such announcement is being made as a result of a letter of resignation from Max E. Burnside, who's term will expire on June 30, 1994. Upon a motion duly made, seconded and passed, the County Commission put Wayne L. Wigal in nomination. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

On this date, the County Commission, upon a motion made by Jean Grapes, seconded by Steven A. Grimm and passed, authorized Holmes R. Shaver, in his official capacity as President, to enter into a Maintenance Agreement with American Office Systems, Charleston, WV, in regard to the Lanier Copier No. 3022, Serial No. 114154 located in the Wood County Prosecuting Attorney's Office. The annual charge for said Maintenance Agreement is in the amount of \$840.00 and provides full coverage (drum and black developer included) for such Lanier Copier with copy allowance to 240,000 per year. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

Having no scheduled appointments or further business to attend to, the County Commission adjourned at 4:00 P.M.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARKERSBURG that in accordance with Section 2.104 of the Charter of the City of Parkersburg, the Council Election Districts of the City are hereby redistricted as follows:

The 1990 census figures were 33,862, and when divided by nine Council districts, each district should have as close to 3,762 residents as possible.
