On this date, came Michele Rusen, Prosecuting Attorney and presented an Order from the Circuit Court of Wood County which requested that the Court enter an Order appointing a Special Prosecutor to handle the prosecution in the State of West Virginia, Plaintiff, v. Murray Mack. This particular case involves allegations of criminal misconduct made by an individual whom the Wood County Prosecuting Attorney's Office has already prosecuted in a cross complaint arising out of the same circumstances. It would therefore be inappropriate for the Prosecuting Attorney or any member of her office to handle the prosecution of this matter. The Circuit Court did Order on July 27, 1994 that David Greene, Attorney be appointed as Special Prosecutor to act in said case.

On this date, the County Commission was in receipt of an acknowledgement letter from the Juvenile Justice Specialist of the Criminal Justice and Highway Safety Division, Department of Military Affairs and Public Safety, Charleston, WV, in regard to an Application for funding in the amount of \$15,000.00 for a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) Program. Receipt of said acknowledgement letter is pursuant to an Order bearing the date of July 14, 1994, at which time the Application was signed by Holmes R. Shaver, President. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

On this date, the County Commission was in receipt of an acknowledgement letter from the Juvenile Justice Specialist in regard to an Application for funding in the amount of \$15,000.00 for a Youth in Effective Legal Diversion (Y.I.E.L.D.) Program. Receipt of said acknowledgement letter is pursuant to an Order bearing the date of

July 14, 1994 at which time the Application was signed by Holmes R. Shaver, President. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

On this date, the County Commission was in receipt of acknowledgement letter from the Highway Safety Division, Department of Military Affairs and Public Safety, Charleston, WV, in regard to an application for funding in the amount of \$59,024.00. Receipt of said letter is pursuant to an Order bearing the date of July 21, 1994 at which time the Application was signed by Holmes R. Shaver, President. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.




Dear Governor Caperton:


We in Wood County have a problem that could very well jeopardize the safety and welfare of those travelling the Little Kanawha River. A large collection of debris has accumulated against the bridge pier and extends out to the center channel of the river. With the numerous recreational activities; such as water skiing, boat riding, jet skiing, etc., being conducted on the river, we felt it should be someone's responsibility to take care of this problem. However, we have contacted the Corps of Engineers and the Coast Guard, both of which have stated it is not their responsibility to clear debris from the river. The Department of Highways stated that the clearing of such debris was not a priority with them since the structure of the bridge is not in danger. Therefore, we would like to request your assistance in providing a solution to the problem of the collection of such debris in the Little Kanawha River.
