## IN THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF WOOD COUNTY, WEST VIRGINIA

IN RE: MINUTES OF MEETING HELD THURSDAY, JUNE 13, 1996

PRESENT: JEAN GRAPES, PRESIDENT

STEVEN A. GRIMM, COMMISSIONER HOLMES R. SHAVER, COMMISSIONER

On this date, the County Commission of Wood County met in regular session. They signed purchase orders, invoices and other correspondence.

On this date, the County Commission, upon a motion made by Steven A. Grimm, seconded by Jean Grapes and passed, approved minutes from Monday, April 1, 1996; Thursday, April 4, 1996 and Monday, April 8, 1996.

At 9:15 A.M., Juliette R. Taylor was sworn in as a Humane
Officer for the Humane Society of Parkersburg.

At 9:30 A.M., the County Commission met with Tom Yeager and Dan Marshall to discuss a proposal for a single family housing program.

Ar. Yeager stated that the proposal is an off-shoot of the idea that they did years ago on the single family mortgage revenue bonds; this program will be different in that these will be governmental bonds in the sense that three or four year is all the longer these bonds will run; the program would be approximately fifty to sixty million collars; the program will allow the people to borrow their closing costs and downpayment; they will be leasing the houses for the first three years from the trustee, at the end of this three years they will have accumulated enough money in their escrow fund that it will cover their downpayment and the closing costs and then the title will be turned over to them; the rate will be locked in so they will know what their payments are; they have targeted only a few counties:

Berkeley, Jefferson, Harrison, Monongalia, Marion, Cabell, Putnam and Wood County; the resolution they have presented that says to go ahead and get the study done and if the study shows the deal is feasible, they will move forward; it does not require the Commission to spend any money at any time, it will take four to five years to see a return in the excess money. Mr. Marshall stated that it could be either new construction or existing housing. The County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion made by Holmes R. Shaver, seconded by steven A. Grimm and made unanimous by Jean Grapes, did hereby ADOPT Resolution presented by G. Thomas Yeager of Ferris, Baker Watts, Incorporated and Dan A. Marshall, Attorney, in regard to the issuance of tax-exempt revenue bonds to promote economic and community The aforementioned motion gave development in Wood County. authorization to Jean Grapes, as president and on behalf of the county Commission, to sign the said Resolution. With the execution of the said Resolution, permission is hereby given to Ferris, Baker Watts, Incorporated, as Underwriter, to pursue the bond program with additional counties. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

At 10:00 A.M., the County Commission held a meeting to accept public input in regard to refuse clearance ordinance. The tape was inadvertently taped over. A list of those in attendance is attached to these minutes. The County Commission did hereby ADOPT an Ordinance Requiring Clearance of Refuse or Debris upon a motion made by Steven A. Grimm, seconded by Holmes R. Shaver and made unanimous by Jean Grapes. The adoption of such Ordinance is pursuant to Chapter 7, Article 1, Section 3ff of the Code of West Virginia of

931 as amended. A copy of said Ordinance is attached to these minutes. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

At 11:00 A.M., the County Commission met with Tiano-Knopp Associates to discuss a grant application. The County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion made by Steven A. Grimm, seconded by Holmes R. Shaver and made unanimous by Jean Grapes, did hereby ADOPT Resolution by affixing their signatures upon such Resolution in which it is RESOLVED that the President of the County Commission of Wood County be and is hereby authorized to sign the grant application for the Drug and Violent Crime Control Program from the Criminal Justice and Highway Safety Office of the Department of Military Affairs Public Safety, West Virginia. The and State of aforementioned grant application requests funding in the amount of nine thousand seventy-six dollars and 00/100ths cents (\$9,076.00) to enable the continuation of the Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) Program through the Wood County Sheriff's Department for the fourth and final consecutive year. The said D.A.R.E. program is at Blennerhassett Elementary School, being promoted Elementary School, Lubeck Elementary School and Mineral Wells Elementary School. Matching funds in the amount of one thousand eight dollars and 00/100ths cents (\$1,008.00) would be required from the County. The funding would be used as overtime compensation for the two deputies assigned by the Sheriff's Department to the aforementioned D.A.R.E. Program. If given approval, the project period would begin on August 1, 1996 and continue through September \$0, 1997. In addition to the signing of the said Grant Application,

Jean Grapes signed the Special Conditions and Assurances in regard to the said D.A.R.E. Program. The said Grant Application, the Special Conditions and Assurances and all documentation pertaining to the said D.A.R.E. Program is on file in the Office of the County Administrator. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

On this date came R. Vance Golden, III, counsel for David W. and Mary I. Jeffrey et al and pursuant to his request to close a road and easement; a hearing was scheduled and allotted to the Petitioners and the Commission does ORDER that the Petition be filed and that a hearing be set upon the merits of the petition at 10:30 A.M. on the 27th day of June, 1996, at the chambers of the County Commission in the Courthouse, the petitioners to provide notice thereof in accordance with 7-1-3h of the West Virginia Code as amended. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

At 11:30 A.M., Dave Roberts and Scott Schwarts from Parkersburg
Benefits met with the Commission to give an update on the Employee
Health Insurance. This portion of the tape was also taped over.

On this date, the County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion made by Holmes R. Shaver, seconded by Steven A. Grimm and passed, adopted a Resolution in reference to Budget Revision No. 24 in the General County Fund budget for the fiscal year 1995/1996. The Request for Revision to the Approved Budget, being submitted to the Department of Tax and Revenue, Charleston, West Virginia, was signed by Jean Grapes, President of the Wood County Commission. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

On this date, the County Commission of Wood County, upon a

motion made by Holmes R. Shaver, seconded by Steven A. Grimm and passed, adopted a Resolution in reference to Budget Revision No. 23 in the General County Fund budget for the fiscal year 1995/1996. The Request for Revision to the Approved Budget, being submitted to the Department of Tax and Revenue, Charleston, West Virginia, was signed by Jean Grapes, President of the Wood County Commission. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

Having no further scheduled appointments or business to attend to, the County Commission adjourned at 12:00 Noon.

## AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING CLEARANCE OF REFUSE OR DEBRIS

This matter coming before the Wood County Commission on this the 13 day of	
June, 1996, and a quorum of the Commission being present, it is hereby moved by	
Commissioner <u>Gumm</u> , and seconded by Commissioner <u>Shauer</u> that pursuan	nt
to West Virginia Code 7-1-3ff, the following Ordinance be enacted:	

Upon a determination by the state fire marshal or by the county health officer as their respective duties are set forth in West Virginia Code 7-1-3ff, and upon determination by the Wood County Commission that substantial accumulations of refuse or the presence of debris as described therein exist upon private land, and upon adherence to the procedures set forth in West Virginia Code 7-1-3ff(b), (c)(1)-(4), and (d), it is hereby Ordered that upon issuance of a request for payment by the Wood County Commission, a landowner of any nonfarm dwelling or building receiving such invoice is hereafter required to pay for the costs of clearing any refuse or debris, or the cost of repairing, vacating, closing, removing, demolishing or otherwise altering any dwelling or nonfarm building. The Commission shall also have the authority to seek reimbursement for such costs by filing a lien against the real property in question for an amount not to exceed the assessed value of the property as recorded int he office of the county assessor, or to institute a civil action in a court of competent jurisdiction against the landowner or other responsible party for all costs incurred by the county with respect to the property and for reasonable attorney fees and court costs incurred in the prosecution of the action, Provided that the procedures as set forth in West Virginia Code 7-1-3ff are adhered to in this process.
