This program offers these **free** or **low-cost** services to women who qualify:

- mammograms for women age 50 and older
- Pap tests and pelvic exams for women age 25 and older
- breast exams by a doctor or nurse
- colposcopy, colposcopy with biopsy, ultrasound and fine needle aspiration when necessary
- free information about how to find breast and cervical cancer early

You may qualify if you meet the following income guidelines and you do not have health insurance, or your health insurance does not cover the services:

All women need to:

- Get a Pap test every year or as often as your doctor or nurse tells you to
- Check your breasts every month
- Have a doctor or nurse check your breasts every year
- Talk to your doctor or nurse about when to start and how often to get a mammogram

Also, women 50 years old and older need to:

- Get a mammogram every year

Remember...

For 48 hours before your Pap test:

- Do not douche
- Do not have sex
- Do not use a tampon

On the day of your mammogram:

- Do not use deodorant, perfume, powder or ointment in the underarm area or on your breasts

Schedule your appointment for a Pap test or mammogram around 10 days after your period starts. If you are no longer having a period, schedule your appointment for the same time every year.
