

IN THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF WOOD COUNTY, WEST VIRGINIA

IN RE: MINUTES OF MEETING HELD  
THURSDAY, JUNE 13, 2002

PRESENT: ROBERT K. TEBAY, PRESIDENT  
RICK MODESITT, COMMISSIONER  
K.D. MERRITT, COMMISSIONER

On this date, the County Commission of Wood County met in regular session. They signed purchase orders, invoices and other correspondence.

At 9:30 A.M., the County Commission met with Jim Mylott from the Mid-Ohio Valley Regional Council. The County Commission, upon a motion made by K.D. Merritt, seconded by Rick Modesitt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay, Ordered that their signatures be applied to the Sequelle Grant Application.

At 10:00 A.M., the County Commission met with Fred J. Krieg, Krieg & Associates; Larry Johnson and Carol Barth, Juvenile Probation Office; and Toni Tiano, Grant Consultant. Mr. Krieg explained to the Commission that they need \$14,000.00 to continue the Y.I.E.L.D./Q.U.I.T. Program until they can get funding. They also need a dollar-to-dollar match so it will help them get funding. After discussion, the County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion made by Rick Modesitt, seconded by K.D. Merritt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay, approved the request of funds to match dollar for dollar up to the amount of seven thousand dollars and 00/100ths cents (\$7,000.00), which will be used to continue the Y.I.E.L.D./QUIT Program, if needed, until they can get funding from other sources. Five thousand dollars and 00/100ths cents (\$5,000.00) of the seven thousand dollars and 00/100ths cents (\$7,000.00) will be given in July, 2002. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

The 10:30 A.M. appointment with Terry Brown, E-911/Emergency Services Director, was cancelled.

At 11:30 A.M., the County Commission met with Bill Morehead, Jeff Johnson and Tommy Bolen from General Ambulance. Also present was Larry Stephens from Camden-Clark Memorial Hospital and Mike St.Clair, who stated he was not present in his capacity as County Coroner, he was present as a citizen of Wood County and Dave Gibson. The gentlemen from General Ambulance spoke about their interest in dedicating an Advance Life Support ambulance to Wood County (A copy of a letter and handout is attached to these minutes and shall be made a part thereof). Mr. St.Clair asked questions of the General Ambulance representatives (A copy of the questions and answers is also attached to these minutes and shall be made a part thereof). After lengthy discussion, the County Commission, upon a motion made by K.D. Merritt, seconded by Rick Modesitt and passed, the County Commission stated they do not wish to act today. Upon a motion made by Rick Modesitt, seconded by K.D. Merritt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay, the County Commission ORDERED that this be tabled.

The County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion made by K.D. Merritt, seconded by Rick Modesitt and passed, ORDERED that Erroneous Assessment Application No. 636 pertaining to personal property, be denied due to the fact there is insufficient documentation to prove the need for said exoneration. Said Erroneous Assessment Application is in the name of City Iron & Metal Co. Inc. and is for property located in Parkersburg City District. Commissioner Tebay abstained.

The County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion duly made, seconded and passed, reappointed Gary Deem, City of Vienna; S.F. Greiner, Wood County Sheriff; Charles Meyers, Wood County Firefighters Association; and John Knapp, City of Parkersburg, to the

911 Advisory Board. Said nominations are pursuant to an Order appearing in Order Book 51, at Page 433 and bearing the date of April 1, 1991, dealing with the procedure policy for appointments to Boards and Authorities. The new terms will expire on April 30, 2005. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

The County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion duly made, seconded and passed, announced that a vacancy exists on the 911 Advisory Board. Said vacancy is pursuant to a letter of resignation from Sgt. B.D. Adkins, the West Virginia State Police and is further pursuant to an Order appearing in Order Book 51, at Page 433 and bearing the date of April 1, 1991, dealing with the procedure policy for appointments to Board and Authorities. The term will expire on April 30, 2003. The County Commission, upon a motion made by Rick Modesitt, seconded by K.D. Merritt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay, placed Guy Brown in nomination to fill said vacancy. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

Terry L. Brown, Director of Wood County Emergency Services/E-9-1-1, presented to the County Commission of Wood County, a New Road Name Request Form from A. Wayne and Barbara Bargeloh to name the road to their residence. The said Request does not interfere with the scheduled readdressing and mapping for the E-9-1-1 Master Street Addressing Guide. A. Wayne and Barbara Bargeloh requested the road be named MASON DRIVE. The road to be known as MASON DRIVE provides access to the Bargeloh's residence as stated in their Request Form. The road to be known as MASON DRIVE is located off Route 14, past the 7-11 and housing development, third driveway on left and is in Slate Taxing District, Tax Map 50, Parcel Number F28. The request by A. Wayne and Barbara Bargeloh is in accordance with Chapter 7, Article 1, Section 3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, which deals, in part, with the County Commission naming or renaming thereof of roads, ways, streets, avenues,


drives and the like to assure uniform, nonduplicative conversion of all rural routes to city-type addressing on a permanent basis. The County Commission does hereby find that the said request, made in writing, by A. Wayne and Barbara Bargeloh, and the approval from the Wood County Emergency Services/E-9-1-1, is in proper form and is hereby ORDERED to be filed. NOW, THEREFORE, the County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion made by K.D. Merritt, seconded by Rick Modesitt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay, does hereby ORDER that the aforementioned road be named MASON DRIVE. The County Commission does further ORDER that a copy of the ORDER, along with the New Road Name Request Form, be certified by the Clerk of the County Commission for entry in the Office of the Clerk of the County Commission. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

The County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion duly made, seconded and passed, announced that a vacancy will exist on the Wood County Solid Waste Authority. Said vacancy is due to the fact that Mr. Ridenour's term will expire June 30, 2002 and is further pursuant to an Order appearing in Order Book 51, at Page 433 and bearing the date of April 1, 1991, dealing with the procedure policy for appointments to Board and Authorities. The County Commission, upon a motion made by K.D. Merritt, seconded by Rick Modesitt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay, placed Willis Ridenour in nomination for reappointment. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

Having no further scheduled appointments or business to attend to, the County Commission adjourned at 12:00 Noon.




Dear President Tebay:
