At 9:25 A.M., the County Commission of Wood County met Ex-Officio, along with the Board of Education, as a Board of Canvassers, to canvass and ascertain the results of the Excess Levy Election, held on October 18, 2003. Present were Robert K. Tebay and Rick Modesitt, and K.D. Merritt, County Commissioners; Jamie Six, Clerk of the County Commission; Jay Day, Administrative Assistant; Melody Woollard, Liz Adkins, Deputy Clerks; Angi Barry, Wood County Commission Secretary; Pam Brust, The Parkersburg News and Sentinel; Ronnie Bibbee, Rodney Crites and Dave Sprague, Maintenance Department; Lori Williamson, Tim Yeater, Harley E. Bailey, John Coe, John Marlow and Jim Fox, Board of Education; Bill Niday, Wood County Schools Superintendent; Sharon Buzzard, Superintendent's Secretary; Mike Falk, Ray Pyles, Tom Little, Sue Woodward, Lenora Rogers, Sara Fitch, Kimberly Shultz and Leota Patton. The ballots, tally sheets and certification of the various voting places were placed before the Board of Canvassers at 9:30 A.M.

Jamie Six, Clerk of the County Commission of Wood County, submitted the list of replacement poll workers that worked the October 18, 2003 Excess Levy Election. Upon a motion made by Rick Modesitt, seconded by K.D. Merritt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay, the County Commission approved said list of replacement poll workers. The Board of Education members also approved said list. A copy of the list of replacement poll workers is

attached to this Order and shall be made a part thereof. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

Jamie Six, Clerk of the County Commission of Wood County, submitted the list of unused ballots from the October 18, 2003 Excess Levy Election. Said action is in compliance with Election Law 3-4A-19, Sections 63 through 78 of the West Virginia Code, as amended. The said list of Unused Ballots is hereby accepted by this County Commission, upon a motion made by K.D. Merritt, seconded by Rick Modesitt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

Decisions on the challenge ballots (provisionals) Precincts 1 through 16 were made by motions made by Rick Modesitt, seconded by K.D. Merritt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay. (Copies of the tally sheets showing how many in each precinct were sustained or overruled are attached to these minutes and should be made a part thereof.)

Decisions on Precincts 17 through 23 were made by motions made by K.D. Merritt, seconded by Rick Modesitt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay.

Decisions on Precincts 24 through 60 were made by motions made by K.D. Merritt, seconded by Rick Modesitt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay.

At 11:05 A.M., the Board of Canvassers took a break until 11:15 A.M.

Decisions on Precincts 61 through 74B were made by motions made by K.D. Merritt, seconded by Rick Modesitt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay.

At 11:25 A.M., the County Commission, upon a motion made by K.D. Merritt, seconded by Rick Modesitt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay, recessed to attend a scheduled meeting in their office.

At 11:30 A.M., the County Commission met with Dan Marshall, Attorney and Fred Williams from Steptoe and Johnson, to discuss the closing documents of Industrial Development Revenue Bonds for Waste Management of West Virginia. After discussion, the County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion made by Robert K. Tebay, seconded by K.D. Merritt and passed, did hereby AUTHORIZE Rick Modesitt, in his official capacity as President and on behalf of the County Commission, to EXECUTE the Engagement Letter setting forth certain matters concerning the services that will be performed by Steptoe and Johnson, Attorneys at Law, Clarksburg, West Virginia, as bond counsel to the County Commission of Wood County in connection with the issuance of the Variable Rate Demand Solid Waste Disposal Revenue Bonds for the Waste Management of West Virginia, Inc. Project, Series 2003A. Documentation pertaining to the Variable Rate Demand Solid Waste Disposal Revenue Bonds is on file in the Office of the County Administrator. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

Rick Modesitt, in his official capacity as President and on behalf of the County Commission. did hereby EXECUTE the following documents:

EXECUTION of such documents is pursuant to an Order appearing in Order Book 66 at Page 69 and dated October 23, 2003, at which time the County Commission of Wood County

EXECUTED an ORDER in which Rick Modesitt is hereby AUTHORIZED to EXECUTE such documents as set forth in the Bond Authorizing Resolution.

The aforementioned documents are in reference to the Variable Rate Demand Solid Waste Disposal Revenue Bonds, Waste Management of West Virginia, Inc. Project, Series 2003A. Documentation pertaining to the Variable Rate Demand Solid Waste Disposal Revenue Bonds, Series 2003A is on file in the Office of the County Administrator. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

The Commission, sitting as the Board of Canvassers, met again at 11:50 A.M.

Decisions on Precincts 74C through 89 were made upon motions made by K.D. Merritt, seconded by Rick Modesitt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay.

The County Commission, upon a motion made by K.D. Merritt, seconded by Rick Modesitt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay, accepted the five late absentee ballots received by mail and voted to sustain one provisional.

After a hand count, there were one hundred twelve votes for the levy and thirty-eight voted against the levy. According to Jamie Six, County Clerk, there were three ballots that weren't counted at a precinct and two empty envelopes were found; also there were ten more votes found for Precinct 60.

At 12:30 P.M., it appearing to this Board of Canvassers that the challenged ballots, in the various precincts, were properly made, the challenges either over-ruled or sustained, and other changes in the tabulation of voters were altered, the canvass is complete, as required by law, and the Board, upon a motion made by K.D. Merritt, seconded by Rick Modesitt and made unanimous by Robert K. Tebay, along with the Board of Education members, do hereby declare the election results. The Board adjourned as the Board of Canvassers at 12:35 P.M.

until Thursday, October 30, 2003, at which time they will certify the results of said election. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

The County Commission went back to their office on second floor to handle County business.

The County Commission, upon a motion duly made, seconded and passed, approved Erroneous Assessment Applications in regard to personal property for Glenna Beatty – Parkersburg City District (2002); Information Leasing Corp. – Vienna District (three for 2003) and Provident Lease Receivable – Parkersburg City District (2003).

The County Commission, upon a motion duly made, seconded and passed, approved Erroneous Assessment Applications in regard to real property for Denzil C. Britton – Lubeck District (two for 1998, two for 1999, two for 2000, two for 2001, two for 2002, 2003); Susan E. Grant Est. – Walker District (2002); Phil Stoneking – Parkersburg City District (2003); Nellie L. Russell – Lubeck District (2002 & 2003); Katherine M. Kennedy – Parkersburg City District (2002); Cara L. Clegg – Union District (2003); Lawrence E. Rockhold – Lubeck District (2002); Rebecca A. Grogg – Lubeck District (2002); Barbara F. Bedilion – Lubeck District (2002); Robert Sees – Lubeck District (2002); and Lydons, Inc. – Lubeck District (2003).

Terry L. Brown, Director of Wood County Emergency Services/E-9-1-1, presented to the County Commission of Wood County, a New Road Name Request Form from Douglas B. Moore to name the road to his residence. The said Request does not interfere with the scheduled readdressing and mapping for the E-9-1-1 Master Street Addressing Guide. Douglas B. Moore, along with Dave Moore requested the road be named WHISPERING WINDS DRIVE. The road to be known as WHISPERING WINDS DRIVE provides access

to their residences as stated in Douglas B. Moore's Request Form. The road to be known as WHISPERING WINDS DRIVE is located right on Chesterville Road in Slate Taxing District, Tax Map 60, Parcel Number 0023. The request by Douglas B. Moore is in accordance with Chapter 7, Article 1, Section 3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, which deals, in part, with the County Commission naming or renaming thereof of roads, ways streets, avenues, drives and the like to assure uniform, nonduplicative conversion of all rural routes to city-type addressing on a permanent basis. The County Commission does hereby find that the said request, made in writing, by Douglas B. Moore, and the approval from the Wood County Emergency Services/E-9-1-1, is in proper form and is hereby ORDERED to be filed. NOW, THEREFORE, the County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion made by Robert K. Tebay, seconded by K.D. Merritt and made unanimous by Rick Modesitt, does hereby ORDER that the aforementioned road be named WHISPERING WINDS DRIVE. The County Commission does further ORDER that a copy of the ORDER, along with the New Road Name Request Form, be certified by the Clerk of the County Commission for entry in the Office of the Clerk of the County Commission. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

The County Commission of Wood County was in receipt of the Grant Award and the fully EXECUTED Grant Program Contract between the WEST VIRGINIA DEVELOPMENT OFFICE and the WOOD COUNTY COMMISSION in regard to the Erickson All-Sports Facility. Receipt of such fully EXECUTED Grant Program Contract is pursuant to an ORDER appearing in Order Book 66, at Page 47 and bearing the date of September 29, 2003, at which time the aforementioned Grant Program Contract was EXECUTED by Rick Modesitt, in his official capacity as President and on behalf of the County Commission. The

aforementioned Governor's Community Partnership Grant is in the amount of seventy-five thousand dollars and 00/100ths cents (\$75,000.00). Documentation pertaining to the said Grant is on file in the Office of the County Administrator. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

The County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion made by Robert K. Tebay, seconded by K.D. Merritt and made unanimous by Rick Modesitt, did hereby AUTHORIZE Rick Modesitt, in his official capacity as President and on behalf of the County Commission, to EXECUTE the Request for Reimbursement in regard to the Wood/Jackson Regional Highway Safety Program Grant Number F03HS-11. Expenditures in the amount of forty-seven thousand one hundred seventy-six dollars and seven cents (\$47,176.07) were incurred by Wood County during the period of July 1, 2003 to September 30, 2003, and represents payment of contractual services provided by Tiano-Knopp Associates, Inc., Grant Consultants for Wood County; for travel and training expenses incurred by the aforementioned Grant Consultants, for materials, supplies and postage as set forth in the said Grant; and for overtime expenses incurred by the City of Vienna, the City of Parkersburg, the City of Ripley, the City of Williamstown, the City of West Union, the City of St. Marys, the Jackson County Sheriff's Department, the Wood County Sheriff's Department, The Gilmer County Sheriff's Department, and the Wirt County Sheriff's Department, whose law enforcement officials participated in the Transportation Enforcement Area Project, the Child Seat Clinics and the Red Light Running Project. In addition to the Request for Reimbursement; the Grant Progress Report; the Time and Attendance Reports for the Grant Consultants; the Travel and Expense Accounts for the Grant Consultants; bulk mailing postage; the Time Records for law enforcement officers from the Vienna Police Department; the Williamstown Police

Department, the Parkersburg Police Department, the Ripley Police Department, the West Union Police Department, the St. Marys Police Department, the Wood County Sheriff's Department, the Gilmer County Sheriff's Department, the Wirt County Sheriff's Department and the Jackson County Sheriff's Department; the Activity Report of the Vienna Police Department; the Activity Report of the Wood County Sheriff's Department, the Activity Report of the Wirt County Sheriff's Department, the Activity Report of the Gilmer County Sheriff's Department, the Activity Report of the Williamstown Police Department, the Activity Report of the Parkersburg Police Department, the Activity Report of the West Union Police Department, the Activity Report of the Ripley Police Department, the Activity Report of the St. Marys Police Department; and the Project Financial Report are being submitted to the West Virginia Highway Safety Program, Charleston, West Virginia. Documentation pertaining to the Wood/Jackson Regional Highway Safety Program Grant is on file in the Office of the County Administrator. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

Terry L. Brown, Director of Wood County Emergency Services/E-9-1-1, presented to the County Commission of Wood County, a New Road Name Request Form from Wood County Emergency Services to name the road to their office. The said Request does not interfere with the scheduled readdressing and mapping for the E-9-1-1 Master Street Addressing Guide. The Wood County Emergency Services requested the road be named TIMBER LANE. The road to be known as TIMBER LANE provides access to the building as stated in the Wood County Emergency Services' Request Form. The road to be known as TIMBER LANE is located in Clay Taxing District, Tax Map 290, Parcel Number 290. The request by the Wood County Emergency Services is in accordance with Chapter 7, Article 1, Section 3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, which deals, in part, with the

County Commission naming or renaming thereof of roads, ways, streets, avenues, drives and the like to assure uniform, nonduplicative conversion of all rural routes to city-type addressing on a permanent basis. The County Commission does hereby find that the said request, made in writing, by the Wood County Emergency Services, and the approval from the E-9-1-1, is in proper form and is hereby ORDERED to be filed. NOW, THEREFORE, the County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion made by Robert K. Tebay, seconded by K.D. Merritt and made unanimous by Rick Modesitt, does hereby ORDER that the aforementioned road be named TIMBER LANE. The County Commission does further ORDER that a copy of the ORDER, along with the New Road Name Request Form, be certified by the Clerk of the County Commission for entry in the Office of the Clerk of the County Commission. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

The County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion made by K.D. Merritt, seconded by Robert K. Tebay and made unanimous by Rick Modesitt, did hereby ORDER that the following be utilized in regard to payment of County employees for the Special Election held on Saturday, October 18, 2003, by the Board of Education.

1. County Employees that worked on Saturday, October 18, 2003, are to be compensated at one and one half (1 ½) times their regular pay.
2. County employees that did not work on Saturday, October 18, 2003, are to receive eight (8) hours of comp time or eight (8) hours of regular pay.

An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

The County Commission of Wood County was in receipt of the New Pledged Security Notification from Wachovia Bank (United National Bank), Parkersburg, West Virginia, which has pledged securities as a County Depository. The New Pledged Security Notification reflects three hundred fifty thousand dollars and 00/100ths cents (\$350,000.00) in United



The County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion made by Robert K. Tebay, seconded by K.D. Merritt and made unanimous by Rick Modesitt, did hereby ORDER that the bid be let for the demolition, removal, and cleanup of property located at 1001 Benton Avenue, Parkersburg, West Virginia, and owned by Betty Bibbee. Betty Bibbee is deceased and mail is being delivered to 528 Marrtown Road, Parkersburg, WV, c/o Mary Foutty. At such time as bid specifications are completed, the County Commission shall place a Legal Notice in both local newspapers, The Parkersburg News and The Parkersburg Sentinel, requesting proposals for demolition, removal and cleanup of the aforementioned property. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.

The County Commission of Wood County, upon a motion made by Robert K. Tebay, seconded by K.D. Merritt and made unanimous by Rick Modesitt, did hereby ORDER that the bid for the demolition of a structure located at 534 Marrtown Road, Parkersburg, West Virginia, the removal of all debris, vines, weeds and underbrush from said property be AWARDED to Empire Builders, Inc., 101 Empire Lake Drive, Parkersburg, West Virginia. The bid received from Empire Builders, Inc. for the aforementioned scope of work was in the amount of five thousand three hundred ninety dollars and 00/100ths cents (\$5,390.00). The AWARDED of such bid is pursuant to an ORDER appearing in Order Book 66, at Page 69 and bearing the date of October 23, 2003, at which time sealed bids for the aforementioned scope of work were opened by the County Commission of Wood County. Documentation pertaining to the demolition and cleanup of the Jeanette S. Sees' property is on file in the Office of the County Administrator. An Order was prepared regarding this matter.


Having no further scheduled appointments or business to attend to, the County Commission adjourned at approximately 2:00 P.M.



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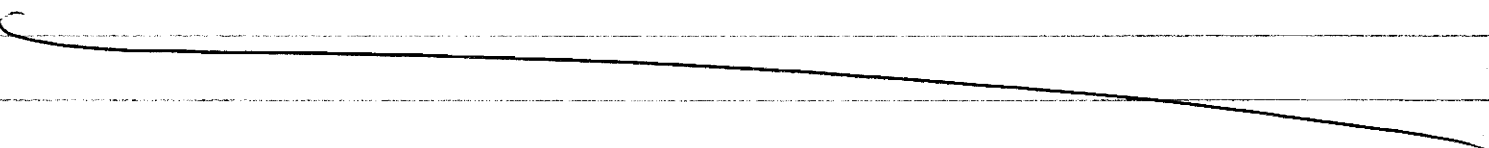
