


The amounts set forth above as "Total Par Amount of Bonds" for the Projects include estimated Costs of Issuance for the Bonds, which may be funded from the proceeds of the Bonds that would be issued in the aggregate principal amount of Sixty Million Eight Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$60,850,000). The Board shall also be authorized to pay such Costs of Issuance from its general funds and/or the proceeds of the Bonds, as the Board deems appropriate at the time such Costs of Issuance are required to be paid.

If the Bond issue is approved by the voters of the School District, the Board receives an award or commitment of West Virginia School Building Authority funds (other Federal, State, local or private funds) sufficient, in the Board's reasonable discretion, to complete the Projects and the Bonds proposed hereby are issued, then, in connection with the Projects proposed in this Order: (a) upon the completion of the new Lubeck Elementary School, existing Lubeck Elementary School would be closed as an elementary school, and certain of those students in grades Pre-K through 5 would be assigned to and attend the new Lubeck Elementary School; (b) upon the completion of the new Consolidated Elementary School in the vicinity of Vienna, West Virginia, existing Vienna Elementary School and Neale Elementary School would each be closed as an elementary school, and certain of those students in grades Pre-K through 5 would be assigned to and attend such new Consolidated Elementary School; and (c) upon the completion of the new Consolidated Elementary School in the vicinity of the North End of Parkersburg, West Virginia, existing Criss Elementary School and Emerson Elementary School would each be closed as an elementary school, and certain of those students in grades Pre-K through 5 would be assigned to and attend such new Consolidated Elementary School would each be closed as an elementary School and Emerson Elementary School would each be closed as an elementary school, and certain of those students in grades Pre-K through 5 would be assigned to and attend such new Consolidated Elementary School.

The issuance of the Bonds is subject to (i)(a) the West Virginia School Building Authority's timely award or commitment of funds to the Board in amounts sufficient, in the Board's reasonable discretion, to undertake and complete the Projects or (b) the availability of other funds to the Board (including Federal, State, local and/or private funds from any source or any combination thereof), in amounts sufficient, in the Board's reasonable discretion, to undertake and complete the Projects and (ii) any and all other necessary actions, approvals and consents required by applicable law.

If the voters of the School District approve the incurring of said debt and the issuance of said Bonds, the Board will lay annually upon the assessed valuation of all the taxable property within the School District an additional levy sufficient to provide funds for the payment of the annual interest upon the Bonds as such interest accrues semiannually and the principal of the Bonds at maturity, for which purposes a levy upon each \$100 valuation, based upon the last assessment of such property for State and County purposes, will be required as follows:

Upon Class I Property approximately 5.44 cents

Upon Class II Property approximately 10.88 cents

Upon Class III Property approximately 21.76 cents

Upon Class IV Property approximately 21.76 cents

For the avoidance of doubt, the levy rates set forth above are in addition to the other levies currently in place in the School District, including the levy in connection with the Board's outstanding Public School Bonds, Series 2017.

The foregoing estimated Project Cost amounts include the costs of acquiring any necessary lands, sites and rights-of-way and easements, if necessary to complete the Projects, the payment of interest on the Bonds while the Projects are under construction and up to six months thereafter, and any engineering and architectural costs, construction costs, including, but not limited to, construction manager fees and expenses, the cost of using county maintenance personnel, the costs of erecting, improving, equipping and furnishing the Projects, the costs and estimated costs of the issuance of the Bonds, and such other costs, fees, and expenses as may be necessary and/or properly incurred in carrying out the Projects. All Handicapped and E.S.S.I.A. Title 1 expenditures are subject to written approval by the West Virginia Department of Education.

The estimated Project Costs set forth above are based upon the estimates provided to the Board by its architects, engineers and other professional advisers, and the actual costs of completing any one or more of the Projects may vary due to circumstances beyond the reasonable control of the Board. To the extent the actual cost to complete any one or more of the Projects is greater or less than such estimates, the Board, in its reasonable discretion, can allocate and expend the available funds (including proceeds of the Bonds, West Virginia School Building Authority grant funds and other funds available to the Board) between the Projects as necessary to carry out the intent of this Order; provided however, that in any event, the Board shall use its best efforts to complete each of the Projects described above, to the extent sufficient funding is available.

If the proceeds of the Bonds and/or amounts allocated for the above-stated purposes are insufficient to complete the Projects, then the Board, in its discretion, shall allocate such shortfall to one or more of the above-stated purposes. In the event the Board shall obtain additional money by grant or otherwise from the State or Federal government, or from any agency of either, or from any other source (including private funds or other available funds of the Board), for use in the acquisition, construction, renovation, improvement, furnishing, and/or equipping of the Projects, such additional money may be used either in substitution for or in addition to the proceeds of the sale of the Bonds proposed hereby, as may be determined by the Board and the granting body or agency, unless otherwise set forth in this Order.

CITY OF PARKERSBURG, WEST VIRGINIA TUESDAY, MAY 10, 2022 LEVY FOR CONTINUED MASS TRANSIT (BUS) SERVICE

Election to authorize the renewal of existing additional levies for the fiscal years beginning July 1, 2023, and July 1, 2024, for the purpose of providing for the continued operation of the mass transit (bus) system in the cities of Parkersburg and Vienna, West Virginia, according to the Order of the Council of the City of Parkersburg adopted on first reading on the 25th day of January, 2022, and on the second and final reading on the 8th day of February, 2022. In the event renewal of existing additional levies are approved by the voters of the City of Parkersburg but disapproved by the voters of the City of Vienna, the funds from said additional levy may be used for the operation of the mass transit (bus) system for routes which originate and terminate within the geographical limits of the City of Parkersburg.

The renewal of the existing additional levy per \$100.00 valuation shall be on Class I property, \$0.06248; on Class II property, \$0.12496; and on Class IV property, \$0.24992. Said rates may be reduced for each levy year if necessary so that the proceeds of the additional levy shall be approximately \$2,172,200,25 per year.
