






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1.0 FORWARD

This Plan has been prepared to be in compliance with the minimum standards established by the Solid Waste Management Board for commercial solid waste facility siting, as officially declared in Title 54, Series 4, Legislative Rules, Solid Waste Management Board of the State of West Virginia. The purpose of this Plan is to not only protect the public health, safety and environment of Wood County but to also ensure the fair and equitable evaluation for of all sites proposed for use as solid waste facilities in the County.

This Plan will also be used to assist the Wood County Solid Waste Authority and other interested parties, municipal or private, in future planning. This Plan is a five-year update to the original Plan which was developed in 2009. Updates will be done at least every five (5) years.

This Siting Plan was developed to work in conjunction with the Wood County Comprehensive Litter and Solid Waste Control Plan as prepared by the Wood County Solid Waste Authority.

2.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Wood County Solid Waste Authority developed its solid waste facility zones in accordance with the guidelines in Title 54, Series 4, Legislative Rules for Commercial Solid Waste Facility Siting Plans, Solid Waste Management Board of the State of West Virginia. In developing this document, the Wood County Solid Waste Authority's goal was to provide for maximum flexibility yet sufficient control over facility siting within Wood County. As a result, the majority of Wood County is zoned "tentatively prohibited". This meant that unless there was readily available information that clearly indicated an area was suitable – or was not suitable - for the location of a solid waste facility, then the area was marked as tentatively prohibited.

Other criteria also used for the siting included:

- The positive or negative effect on economic development;
- The County's transportation network and how it will permit or exclude the effective transportation of solid waste through the facility zones;
- The positive or negative impact on property values;
- The effect the solid waste facility zone will have on protecting the groundwater and surface waters in the area, taking into account wetlands, any surface water, groundwater quality, perennial streams, floodplains, and public or private water supply wells;
- Geological and/or hydrological conditions which may prohibit or enable siting of a facility including underground coal mining;
- The zone's impact of existing aesthetic or environmental conditions, including areas near state highways, interstate, or federal aid primary highways, and boundaries of any public parks;
- The effect on historical or cultural resources;

- Located within six (6) miles of an airport;
- Present or potential land use for residential, commercial, recreational, environmental conservation, or industrial purposes; and
- The consequences to public health, welfare, and convenience.

The Wood County Solid Waste Authority will use this criterion as a base for its decision to prohibit a solid waste facility in a particular zone. Therefore, a decision to authorize a solid waste facility in a particular zone will be made only after review and consideration of all the criteria listed.

To readily distinguish the various zones, the attached Wood County map has been color coded to reflect the authorized, tentatively prohibited, and prohibited zones.

3.0 COMMERCIAL SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL FACILITIES

In general, there is little difference with the siting criteria for zoning solid waste disposal facilities among the various classes. Primarily, the main difference is the size of operation, which has minimal effect on the site zoning distinction. Listed on the following pages are the solid waste disposal facilities definitions and their siting criteria along with information regarding which areas are authorized, prohibited, and tentatively prohibited.

3.1 CLASS A LANDFILL

A “Class A Facility” means a commercial solid waste facility which handles an aggregate of between 10,000 – 30,000 tons of solid waste per month. “Class A facility” includes two or more Class B solid waste landfills owned or operated by the same person in the same county, if the aggregate tons of solid waste handled per month by such landfills exceed 9,999 tons of solid waste per month.

AUTHORIZED

The only authorized Class A Landfill in Wood County is Northwestern Landfill which is located at 512 E. Dry Run Road (off Route 50) in Wood County.

PROHIBITED

The areas that are prohibited are denoted on Map A. These areas are prohibited because of one or more of the criteria established in Title 54 Legislative Rules, Series 4, and since the readily available information clearly establishes that the facilities will:

- Cause a significant adverse upon wetlands
- Cause a significant adverse upon any surface water
- Cause a significant adverse impact upon groundwater quality
- Cause a violation of surface water quality standards found in Legislative Rule 47CR3
- Be within a perennial stream
- Be within a 100-year floodplain
- Be within 300 feet of any surface water (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)
- Be within 1,000 feet of the right-of-way of any state trunk highway, interstate, or federal aid primary highway
- Be within 1,200 feet of any public or private water supply well in existence at the time the zone is established
- Be within 1,200 feet of public parks and recreation areas
- Be within 500 feet of a dwelling
- Be within 200 feet of a geologically unstable area
- Be within 300 feet of any wetlands (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)

- Be within 6 miles of an airport.

TENTATIVELY PROHIBITED

All other areas are tentatively prohibited until it can be determined whether an area is suitable or unsuitable on a site specific basis.

3.2 CLASS B LANDFILL

A “Class B Facility” means a commercial solid waste facility which receives, or is expected to receive, an average daily quantity of mixed solid waste equal to or exceeding 100 tons each working day; or serves, or is expected to serve, a population equal to or exceeding 40,000 persons but which does not receive solid waste exceeding an aggregate of 10,000 tons per month. “Class B Facility” does not include construction/demolition facilities: Provided, that the definition of Class B Facility may include such reasonable subdivisions or subclassifications as the secretary may establish by legislative rule proposed in accordance with the provisions of WV Code Sec. 29A-1-1 et seq.

AUTHORIZED

None.

PROHIBITED

The areas that are prohibited are denoted on Map B. These areas are prohibited because of one or more of the criteria established in Title 54 Legislative Rules, Series 4, and since the readily available information clearly establishes that the facilities will:

- Cause a significant adverse upon wetlands
- Cause a significant adverse upon any surface water
- Cause a significant adverse impact upon groundwater quality
- Cause a violation of surface water quality standards found in Legislative Rule 47CR3
- Be within a perennial stream
- Be within a 100-year floodplain
- Be within 300 feet of any surface water (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)
- Be within 1,000 feet of the right-of-way of any state trunk highway, interstate, or federal aid primary highway
- Be within 1,200 feet of any public or private water supply well in existence at the time the zone is established
- Be within 1,200 feet of public parks and recreation areas
- Be within 500 feet of a dwelling

- Be within 200 feet of a geologically unstable area
- Be within 300 feet of any wetlands (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)
- Be within 6 miles of an airport.

TENTATIVELY PROHIBITED

All other areas are tentatively prohibited until it can be determined whether an area is suitable or unsuitable on a site specific basis.

3.3 CLASS C LANDFILL

A “Class C Facility” means a commercial solid waste facility which receives, or is expected to receive, an average daily quantity of mixed solid waste of less than 100 tons each working day; and serves, or is expected to serve, a population of less than 40,000 persons. “Class C Facility” does not include construction/demolition facilities.

AUTHORIZED

None.

PROHIBITED

The areas that are prohibited are denoted on Map C. These areas are prohibited because of one or more of the criteria established in Title 54 Legislative Rules, Series 4, and since the readily available information clearly establishes that the facilities will:

- Cause a significant adverse upon wetlands
- Cause a significant adverse upon any surface water
- Cause a significant adverse impact upon groundwater quality
- Cause a violation of surface water quality standards found in Legislative Rule 47CR3
- Be within a perennial stream
- Be within a 100-year floodplain
- Be within 300 feet of any surface water (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)
- Be within 1,000 feet of the right-of-way of any state trunk highway, interstate, or federal aid primary highway
- Be within 1,200 feet of any public or private water supply well in existence at the time the zone is established
- Be within 1,200 feet of public parks and recreation areas
- Be within 500 feet of a dwelling
- Be within 200 feet of a geologically unstable area
- Be within 300 feet of any wetlands (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)

- Be within 6 miles of an airport.

TENTATIVELY PROHIBITED

All other areas are tentatively prohibited until it can be determined whether an area is suitable or unsuitable on a site specific basis.

3.4 CLASS D LANDFILL

A “Class D Facility” means any commercial solid waste facility for disposal of only construction/demolition waste and does not include the legitimate beneficial reuse of clean waste concrete/masonry substances for the purpose of structural fill or road base material.

AUTHORIZED

None.

PROHIBITED

The areas that are prohibited are denoted on Map D. These areas are prohibited because of one or more of the criteria established in Title 54 Legislative Rules, Series 4, and since the readily available information clearly establishes that the facilities will:

- Cause a significant adverse upon wetlands
- Cause a significant adverse upon any surface water
- Cause a significant adverse impact upon groundwater quality
- Cause a violation of surface water quality standards found in Legislative Rule 47CR3
- Be within a perennial stream
- Be within a 100-year floodplain
- Be within 300 feet of any surface water (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)
- Be within 1,000 feet of the right-of-way of any state trunk highway, interstate, or federal aid primary highway
- Be within 1,200 feet of any public or private water supply well in existence at the time the zone is established
- Be within 1,200 feet of public parks and recreation areas
- Be within 500 feet of a dwelling
- Be within 200 feet of a geologically unstable area
- Be within 300 feet of any wetlands (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)
- Be within 6 miles of an airport.

TENTATIVELY PROHIBITED

All other areas are tentatively prohibited until it can be determined whether an area is suitable or unsuitable on a site specific basis.

3.5 TRANSFER STATION

“Transfer Station” means a combination of structures, machinery, or devices at a place, or facility where solid waste is taken from collection vehicles and placed in other transportation units (such as a “walking floor” or other method of transfer as determined by the secretary) for movement to another solid waste management facility. Provided, when the initial generator or bin which is temporarily positioned (not more than 5 days) at a specific location for transport by a transportation unit, such container shall not be considered a transfer station. Under any circumstances, leachate, litter, and windblown materials must be properly managed.

AUTHORIZED

None.

PROHIBITED

The areas that are prohibited are denoted on Map E. These areas are prohibited because of one or more of the criteria established in Title 54 Legislative Rules, Series 4, and since the readily available information clearly establishes that the facilities will:

- Cause a significant adverse upon wetlands
- Cause a significant adverse upon any surface water
- Cause a significant adverse impact upon groundwater quality
- Cause a violation of surface water quality standards found in Legislative Rule 47CR3
- Be within a perennial stream
- Be within a 100-year floodplain
- Be within 300 feet of any surface water (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)
- Be within 1,000 feet of the right-of-way of any state trunk highway, interstate, or federal aid primary highway
- Be within 1,200 feet of any public or private water supply well in existence at the time the zone is established
- Be within 1,200 feet of public parks and recreation areas
- Be within 500 feet of a dwelling

- Be within 200 feet of a geologically unstable area
- Be within 300 feet of any wetlands (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)
- Be within 6 miles of an airport.

TENTATIVELY PROHIBITED

All other areas are tentatively prohibited until it can be determined whether an area is suitable or unsuitable on a site specific basis.

3.6 ENERGY RECOVERY AND INCINERATION FACILITIES

3.61 Energy Recovery Facility

Any solid waste facility where solid wastes are incinerated or processed for future incineration with the intention of using the resulting energy for generation of steam, electricity, or any other use not specified in the Regulations is classified as an energy recovery facility.

3.62 Incinerator

An incinerator is any enclosed device using controlled flame combustion to thermally break down solid waste, including refuse-derived fuel, to an ash residue that contains little or no combustible materials.

WV Code Sec. 22-15-19 prohibits, except for certain pilot projects, the installation, establishment or construction of new commercial solid waste facilities that utilize incineration. Furthermore, the Authority is opposed to these types of solid waste facilities until improved technology makes them a viable alternative.

AUTHORIZED

None.

PROHIBITED

For these types of facilities, all areas are prohibited. The limits are interpreted to be the County line. These areas are prohibited because of one or more of the criteria established in WV Code Sec. 22-15-19. The areas that are prohibited are denoted on Map F.

The siting issues that typically are unacceptable for development of a solid waste disposal facility include: perennial streams, floodplains, recreational facilities, schools, land use compatibility, historic and cultural resources, and potential groundwater problems. Major identifiable features are indicated on the map.

TENTATIVELY PROHIBITED

None.

3.7 RECYCLING FACILITIES

A “Recycling Facility” means any solid waste facility for the purpose of recycling at which neither land disposal nor biological, chemical, or thermal transformation of solid waste occurs; Provided, that mixed waste recovery facilities, sludge processing facilities, and composting facilities are not considered to be reusing or recycling sold waste within the meaning of WV Code Sections 20-11-1 et seq., 25-15-1 et seq., and 22C-4-1 et seq.

AUTHORIZED

None.

PROHIBITED

The areas that are prohibited are denoted on Map G. These areas are prohibited because of one or more of the criteria established in Title 54 Legislative Rules, Series 4, and since the readily available information clearly establishes that the facilities will:

- Cause a significant adverse upon wetlands
- Cause a significant adverse upon any surface water
- Cause a significant adverse impact upon groundwater quality
- Cause a violation of surface water quality standards found in Legislative Rule 47CR3
- Be within a perennial stream
- Be within a 100-year floodplain
- Be within 300 feet of any surface water (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)
- Be within 1,000 feet of the right-of-way of any state trunk highway, interstate, or federal aid primary highway
- Be within 1,200 feet of any public or private water supply well in existence at the time the zone is established
- Be within 1,200 feet of public parks and recreation areas
- Be within 500 feet of a dwelling
- Be within 200 feet of a geologically unstable area
- Be within 300 feet of any wetlands (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)

- Be within 6 miles of an airport.

TENTATIVELY PROHIBITED

All other areas are tentatively prohibited until it can be determined whether an area is suitable or unsuitable on a site specific basis.

3.8 MATERIALS RECOVERY FACILITIES

A Materials Recovery Facility is any solid waste facility at which source-separated materials or materials recovered through a mixed waste processing facility are manually or mechanically shredded or separated for purposes of reuse and recycling but does not include a composting facility.

AUTHORIZED

None.

PROHIBITED

The areas that are prohibited are denoted on Map H. These areas are prohibited because of one or more of the criteria established in Title 54 Legislative Rules, Series 4, and since the readily available information clearly establishes that the facilities will:

- Cause a significant adverse upon wetlands
- Cause a significant adverse upon any surface water
- Cause a significant adverse impact upon groundwater quality
- Cause a violation of surface water quality standards found in Legislative Rule 47CR3
- Be within a perennial stream
- Be within a 100-year floodplain
- Be within 300 feet of any surface water (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)
- Be within 1,000 feet of the right-of-way of any state trunk highway, interstate, or federal aid primary highway
- Be within 1,200 feet of any public or private water supply well in existence at the time the zone is established
- Be within 1,200 feet of public parks and recreation areas
- Be within 500 feet of a dwelling
- Be within 200 feet of a geologically unstable area
- Be within 300 feet of any wetlands (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)
- Be within 6 miles of an airport.

TENTATIVELY PROHIBITED

All other areas are tentatively prohibited until it can be determined whether an area is suitable or unsuitable on a site specific basis.

3.9 COMMERCIAL COMPOSTING FACILITIES

A “Commercial Composting Facility” means any solid waste facility processing solid waste by composting, including sludge composting, organic waste, or yard waste composting, but does not include a composting facility owned and operated by a person for the sole purpose of composting waste created by that person and others persons on a cost-sharing or non-profit basis and shall not include land upon which finished or matured compost is applied for use as a soil amendment or conditioner.

AUTHORIZED

None.

PROHIBITED

The areas that are prohibited are denoted on Map I. These areas are prohibited because of one or more of the criteria established in Title 54 Legislative Rules, Series 4, and since the readily available information clearly establishes that the facilities will:

- Cause a significant adverse upon wetlands
- Cause a significant adverse upon any surface water
- Cause a significant adverse impact upon groundwater quality
- Cause a violation of surface water quality standards found in Legislative Rule 47CR3
- Be within a perennial stream
- Be within a 100-year floodplain
- Be within 300 feet of any surface water (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)
- Be within 1,000 feet of the right-of-way of any state trunk highway, interstate, or federal aid primary highway
- Be within 1,200 feet of any public or private water supply well in existence at the time the zone is established
- Be within 1,200 feet of public parks and recreation areas
- Be within 500 feet of a dwelling
- Be within 200 feet of a geologically unstable area

- Be within 300 feet of any wetlands (facility drainage or sedimentation control structures are exempt from this distance calculation)
- Be within 6 miles of an airport.

TENTATIVELY PROHIBITED

All other areas are tentatively prohibited unless it can be determined whether the site is suitable or unsuitable on a site specific basis.

4.0 PROVISIONS OF WOOD COUNTY'S COMPREHENSIVE LITTER AND SOLID WASTE PLAN

The Siting Plan and other solid waste needs for Wood County are being addressed in compliance with the County's Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan. The Authority considers the Siting Plan to be a fundamental prerequisite for establishing prudent solid waste management practices for Wood County. A viable Solid Waste Management Plan is vital to the community's environmental protection, economically important to the business community, and necessary to address the solid waste issues confronting our county, state, and nation during the 21st century.

5.0 AMENDMENT PROCESS

It is mandated that this Plan be updated every five years. However, the Plan can be amended at any time. In order to add updates or amendments to the Plan, a public legal notice and public hearing in accordance with Section 54-4-7 of Title 54, Series 4 must occur. A revised plan is to cover a twenty (20) year period, and the Solid Waste Management Board must approve amendments in the same manner as in the previous plan. Minutes from the Wood County Solid Waste Authority meetings in which the new, updated, or amended plan is approved shall include:

- New, updated, or amended plan.
- Previous plan submitted for approval by the Solid Waste Management Board.
- Minutes signed by the Chair.
- The Solid Waste Authority's responsibility that it is legally constituted to conduct business.

6.0 CONCLUSION

With the preparation of this Solid Waste Facility Siting Plan, the Wood County Solid Waste Authority has attempted to address the minimum standards for siting commercial solid waste disposal facilities for Wood County. It should be noted that this Plan was developed from limited, readily available information; therefore much of Wood County is zoned tentatively prohibited. This siting strategy will not only satisfy the intent of the Title 54, Series 4 Rules, but will also provide the Wood County Solid Waste Authority with the flexibility to consider any viable site in the future after evaluating site specific conditions.

While this Plan is generalized, it is intended that this Siting Plan be updated on a five-year basis. The siting maps were produced on a computer-digitized format so that all future developments can be effectively incorporated into the Plan. A copy of this Plan will be maintained at the Wood County Solid Waste Authority Office and will also be provided to the Mid-Ohio Valley Regional Council (Region V), the Wood County Planning Commission, and the Wood County Clerk. It is intended that Wood County will be a leader and focal point for solid waste management activities in western West Virginia. It is anticipated that this Siting Plan will become the project initiation point and a vital management planning tool for any major future developments.




Wood County Solid Waste Facility Zoning Map: Class A Landfill



Class B Landfill





Wood County Solid Waste Facility Zoning Map


Class C Landfill




Class D Landfill







Wood County Solid Waste Facility Zoning Map Transfer Station






Wood County Solid Waste Facility Zoning Map: Solid Waste Incineration



Wood County Solid Waste Facility Zoning Map: Recycling Facility





Wood County Solid Waste Facility Zoning Map: Materials Recovery Facility








Wood County Solid Waste Facility Zoning Map: Commercial Composting Facility


