This proposed project consists of two components — both of which will benefit the Wood County Sheriff Department employees and the residents of Wood County, West Virginia and both of which are connected to each other. The first component is Integrated Response Training Module which is a joint training with law enforcement officers and educators with regards to mass shootings at school facilities and builds on the premise of "Proactively protecting the innocent and preventing unnecessary loss of life". This training provides all participating officers the opportunity to train alongside the personnel they work with them every day. It gives them a better understanding of what is needed to safety and cohesively respond to an active killer/violent emergency situation.

The second component is the purchase of cell phone jammer equipment. A mobile phone signal jammer is a device that blocks reception between cell towers and mobile phones. Developed for use by the military and law enforcement, these devices were originally created to combat threats like cell phone-triggered explosives and hostage situations.

Both of these components – training and cell phone jammer – will be of great benefit should there be a mass shooting and/or hostage situation in Wood County, West Virginia.

The project goal is to provide the Wood County Sheriff 's Office with the necessary resources required to correctly respond to a school and/or other mass shooting incident. The objectives to accomplish this are: to provide Integrated Response Training to the deputies of the Wood County Sheriff Department and to purchase cell phone jammer equipment.

This project will include the partnership of the Wood County Sheriff's Office and the Wood County Board of Education. Conversations will be held with the other law enforcement agencies within Wood County to get them to also participate in the training. This would be done at their expense.

If these items are funded, the ultimate outcome and deliverables will be a better trained law enforcement department who has a better understanding of what is needed to safely and cohesively respond to an active killer/violent emergency situation. It is hoped that if an active killer/violent emergency situation ever occurs in Wood County, there will be no casualties or any major injuries.

Justice Assistance Grant Wood County Commission/Sheriff Office FY22 Program Narrative

The Wood County Sheriff Department will be purchasing equipment as well as providing training which will assist them with the means to better perform their duties and to provide better protection to the citizens of Wood County. While this equipment and training will be beneficial for many aspects of law enforcement, they will also be extremely beneficial if there should be a mass shooting at a school or other facility within the County.

Project Goal: To enhance safety for the Deputies within the Wood County Sheriff Office as well as the safety of the citizens of Wood County by providing funding to purchase a cell phone jammer and to provide training to those within the Wood County Sheriff's Office on how to effectively respond to a mass shooting whether it be at a school facility or another facility within Wood County. In addition to training for the Wood County Sheriff's Office, there will also be training and commitment from other agencies such as the School System and EMS.

Purchase of cell phone jammer equipment. A mobile phone signal jammer is a device that blocks reception between cell towers and mobile phones. Developed for use by the military and law enforcement, these devices were originally created

to combat threats like cell phone-triggered explosives and hostage situations.

Police often use them to limit or disrupt communications during hostage situations, bomb threats or when military action is underway.

While the use of cell phones is the "norm", these phones can actually make people less safe in a crisis such as the one in Parkland. He ticks off several reasons:

- Using phones can distract people from the actions they need to be taking in the moment, such as running, hiding and listening to directions from first responders.
- 2. The sound of the phone, whether ringing or on vibrate, could alert an assailant to a hiding place.
- 3. The shooter could be monitoring the event themselves on social media and find more victims or elude capture that way.
- 4. Victims and worried family members trying to get through can jam communications, interfering with first responders.

The "Integrated Response Training Module" consists of three phases and is designed for not only law enforcement but for them to partner with school personnel and EMS. The phases consist of the following:

PHASE ONE – Law Enforcement Reality Based Scenario Training which includes: Hands On Range Training, tactical Movement and Communication Techniques, Combat Medic Training, and Rooms and Building Management – Simple Communication.

PHASE TWO – Securing School Complex which includes: evaluating individual school complexes related to safety and security, consistent video security devices, consistent communication protocols, and simple easily consistent visible room/building signage.

PHASE THREE – Educators Reality Based Response Training which includes: distinguishing disturbances and threats, understanding and utilizing communication equipment, and multiple reality-based scenarios.

All of these items will increase officer safety and citizen safety for all of Wood County.

BUDGET AND BUDGET NARRATIVE

The proposal as submitted is for direct costs related to the acquisition of equipment and training for the Wood County Sheriff's Office for items that are outside the Department's normal budgetary allotment. The items to be funded by this grant include:

Purchase of Cell Phone Jammer - a <u>device that blocks reception</u> between cell towers and mobile phones
